Former Sheriff Bob Maddy Dies

Bobby Joe Maddy, 56, of Hinton, died Sun. Mar. 5, 1995 at the Summers Co. ARH following a long illness.

He was born in Bellepoint on Mar. 14, 1938 to Frank Maddy, Jr. and the late Stella Mae Lester Maddy, of Hinton. He graduated from Hinton High School in May 1957. After graduation, he went to Columbus, Oh. where he lived and was District Manager for the P. W. Woolworth Co. He later returned to Hinton, where he attended and graduated from Beckley College, while teaching at Lilly Heights School in Summers County.

He served as Deputy for the Summers Co. Sheriff's Dept. and while doing so attended classes at Bluefield State College majoring in Criminal Justice. He has also served as a Conservation Officer for the Dept. of Natural Resources, a police officer for the city of Hinton, Sheriff of Summers County for two terms, State Dept. of Highways Supervisor in Summers Co. under former Gov. Jay Rockefeller, District Manager for State Dept. of Highways in Mercer Co. during Arch Moore's term as Governor, and presently serving as State Dept. of Highways Supervisor in Summers Co. under Gov. Gaston Caperton.

He was a member of the First Baptist Church in Hinton, a former charter member of the Dawn Sportsman Club, where he was an avid trap shooter, and a former member

of both the Fraternal Order of the Police and the W. V. Sheriff's Association. He also belonged to the Summers Co. Democrats Club and was a member of Hinton Masonic Lodge #62.

Besides his father he is survived by: wife of 23 years Virginia D. Maddy of Hinton; one daughter: Mrs. James E. (Lisa Ann) Beasley of Hinton; one son: Robert Franklin Maddy and wife Susan of Hinton; two step children: Ann D. Jacobs of Venice, Fla.; and Mrs. Johnnie (Cathy) D. Richmond of Talcott; one sister: Betty Maddy Keaton of Hinton; three grandchildren, four step grandchildren, and one step great grandchild.

He was preceded in death by one brother, Benny L. Maddy of Hinton.

Funeral services will be Wed. at 2:00 P.M. at the Ronald Meadows Funeral Parlor Chapel with the Rev. D. D. Elwell officiating. Burial will follow in the Greenbrier Burial Park. Friends may call at the Ronald Meadows Funeral Parlor from 6-9 P.M. Tues.
