
Thomas R. Hartley, Sr. September 23, 1926 – June 28, 2013

Thomas R. (Tom) Hartley Sr. passed away on July 28, 2013 in Gloucester, Virginia after a long battle with dementia. They worked together daily until Tom retired to spend more time at the home they both loved at "the Rivah" in Jamaica, Virginia.

Tom will be remembered by his family as a loving husband and a devoted father, stepfather, and grandfather. His friends will fondly recall his keen sense of humor, his love of Dixieland jazz and sports of all kinds, his enthusiasm for life and his love of a good time.
