Mr. Lipscomb was a native of Hinton, WV and a graduate of Duke University, Class of 1938. He was a member of Kappa Sigma Social Fraternity, Omicron Delta Kappa Society, the Order of Red Friars, and the Tombs. He continued his education, subsequently obtaining a law degree from Duke University in 1941. Mr. Lipscomb excelled in sports at Duke University, serving as captain of the 1937 football team, and was named All-American and served as coach of the freshman football team while attending law school at Duke. Mr. Lipscomb was employed by the Federal Bureau of Investigation from 1941 through 1966, at which time he retired and moved to Boydton. He practiced law in the town of Boydton from 1966 until his death. In 1974 he was appointed Substitute Judge in the General District Courts and the Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Courts of the Tenth Judicial Circuit where he served until January 1, 2004.
