That year we also won second prize for our booth in the intramurals. Officers for our Junior year were: Lottie Wilson, President; Jane Terry, Vice President, Patsy Milligan, Secretary, and Nellie Canterbury, Treasurer. Of course the high-light of that year was our Junior-Senior Banquet and Prom, honoring the Seniors. The banquet and dance was Pirates. The decorating committee worked hard and the stage was transformed into a Pirate ship.

Since then the ranks have decreased a little bit and here we are going through our Senior year. David Hess was chosen as President of the class. Richard Meador, Vice President; Jo Ann Dillon, Secretary; and Phyllis Cales, as Treasurer. Our first event of any importance was the talent show given by the class, presented in November, and was well received. Each of us were found proving ourselves more worthy of our motto, "Forward Ever, Backward Never." Our last part of the Senior year was crowded by activities. First, the senior play then Sneak Day, followed by the Citizenship Pageant, the Commencement Sermon, Commencement exercise, and the Farewell Banquet and Dance. We were all satisfied with the results of our last year.

Thus is completed the four-year history of the Senior Class of 1951.

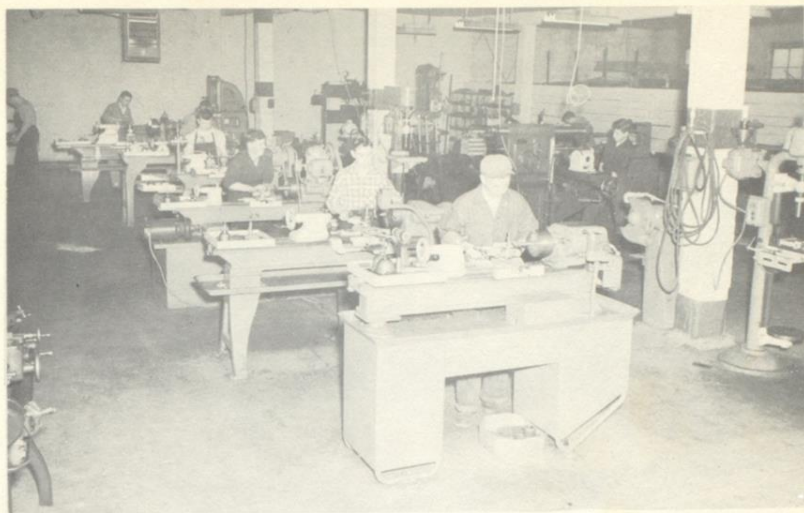

#### SUMMERS COUNTY VOCATIONAL SCHOOL

The Summers County Vocational School has been in operation since the summer of 1947. Since that time the school has been approved and operated under the supervision of the Summers County Board of Education and has been a part of Hinton High School. It is one of several schools set up and approved by the State Department of Vocational Education in Charleston.

The classes meet for three hours each day, and during that time the students have the opportunity of working on lathes, shapers, milling machines, grinders, planers, drill presses, and various machines that are common to the shops in industry. The boys get a thorough course in Blue Print Reading, and some practical drawing that will help them to interpret prints that will be given them in shops in which they might work in later life. They are taught to measure accurately to within a thousandth of an inch, and often are required to make work to those specifications. Several of the boys have finished castings furnished by commercial foundries, into machines and tools that are useful at their homes.

The students attend classes for a period of two years and at the end of that time they receive a certificate from the Vocational School in addition to their regular High School Diploma. Interest has increased in this type of classes due to the practicality of the training, and due to the fact that the students are better equipped to earn a living in industrial work. Several of the graduates have gotten jobs in industrial plants, and others have gone to college to further their education in the field of Industrial Education. Surely our shops have started several boys in an interesting work that they would not have learned anywhere else.

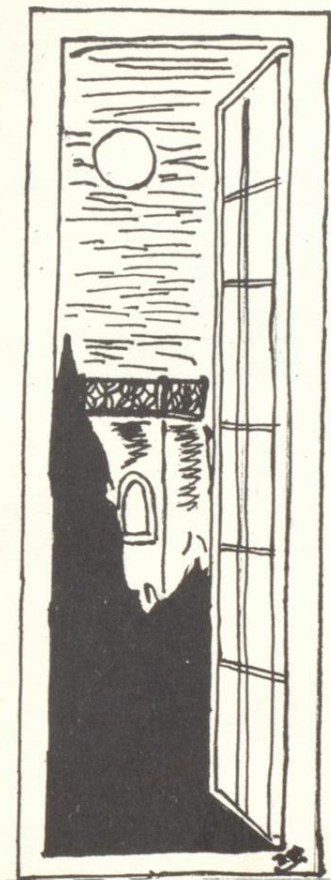

By defeating a good Princeton team the following week, they redeemed themselves in the eyes of the local fans.

Another defeat was handed the boys by a strong Stoco aggregation in a game played on foreign soil.

The fighting Cats hit the victory column again when they outfought the Richwood Lumberjacks in our Homecoming Game, 14-7.

The props were knocked from underneath the Bobcats the following Friday night when they absorbed a 43-7 shellacking from the Oak Hill Red Devils.

Having been down, but never out all season, the tenacious Bobcats wound up their schedule in a blaze of glory by walloping Welch, Logan, and the greatest triumph of them all, Beckely, in that order, to finish with a 6 won, 4 lost record.

It was the first time in 6 years that a Hinton football team had come out victorious over its arch-rivals, the Flying Eagles of Beckley, thereby returning the Wilson Trophy to the Bobcat lair.

Their last season will be long remembered by Capt. Paul Phipps, Ray Surbaugh, John Stewart, Charles Pollock, Garnett Willey, David Hess, James Hinkle, Bill Humphreys, Lester Bennett and Dewitt Gaydosch, the graduating seniors on the squad.

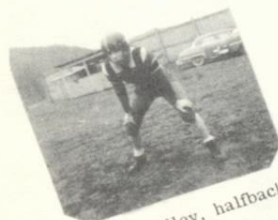
Phipps and Surbaugh were named to the first and third All State teams, respectively.

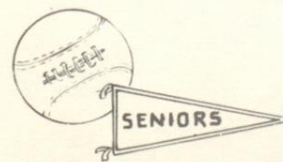
