Eagle Dies At 71

Colonel Harold B. Eagle, County Prosecuting Attorney, died Sunday, December 8 at 1 p.m. at home of an apparent heart attack.

Mr. Eagle, a life long resident of Hinton, was born July 22, 1914, the son of Edward C. and Mary Baker Eagle.

Mr. Eagle was a 1932 graduate of Hinton High School, a graduate of West Virginia University College of Law, entered law practice in Hinton in 1938, was a veteran of World War II and the Korean Conflict and retired as a Colonel. He was elected Mayor of Hinton in 1953 and served until 1961, being six consecutive terms, and again elected Mayor in 1965 and served until 1969. He was a former member of the West Virginia House of Delegates for Sum-

mers County, was elected Prosecuting Attorney for Summers County in 1980 and re-elected in 1984. He was a member of the Hinton United Methodist Church and was presently the teacher of the Mens Bible Class, was a member of the Hinton Elks Lodge and past Exalted Ruler of said lodge.

Survivors include his wife, Doris Loomis Eagle, and a son, Bradley Eagle at home.

Services will be Wednesday at 2 p.m. at the Ronald Meadows Funeral Parlors in Hinton with Drs. Richard Crickard and Al Cone officiating. Burial will follow in the Greenbrier Burial Park in Hinton.
