Waving their orange and black banners and singing their school song, the upper classmen and lower classmen alike, are one in spirit, truth, and loyalty to "dear H. H. S..."


Soon 107 of the 884 Students will turn from the "band" and march into the street of the Future.


Confronting them is all the anticipation, bewilderment, and aspiration associated with innovation---a new parade in life.

Team Record

The Bobcats opened their season against the highly touted Stoco Indians at Stoco. A fourteen point underdog, the 'Cats surprised everyone by rolling to a big 45-12 victory. Angotti lead the scoring with four touchdowns. Anderson scored twice and Peterson once.

Crippled by injuries in the backfield, the Bobcats journeyed to Peterstown, and won by a 31-7 margin over the scrappy Pirates. Adkins, Angotti, Charlton, Connor, and Sowder each scored once.

In their first home game, the Bobcats spotted the aroused Cedar Grove team an early touchdown before going on to win 26-6. Angotti scored twice, Anderson and Sowder each had one.


This poem was engraved in a watch presented to Dave Rubinoff, the great viol'nist, by his friend Will Rogers.
