Anderson Meadows, Real Estate Broker

Anderson D. Meadows, an attorney, real estate broker and former director of Federal procurement for Pennsylvania, died Saturday while playing golf at the Overbrook Golf Club. He was 70 and lived at 734 Rugby rd., Brynmawr.

A native of Hinton, W. Va., Mr. Meadows attended West Virginia University, Penn State University and the University of Michigan Law School. He served in the Army in World War I and practiced law in West Virginia from 1922 to 1932. He again saw Army service in World War II and the Korean conflict, retiring with the rank of colonel.

WON ARMY MEDAL

Mr. Meadows was in charge of the Contract Termination Program of the Signal Corps at the end of World War II and he served as comptroller for the Signal Corps Supply Agency in Philadelphia and later at the Signal Division of the U. S. Army in Europe. He was awarded the Army Commendation Medal.

Following his retirement from the Army in the spring of 1955, he joined the Albert M. Greenfield & Co., Inc., real estate firm here as manager of the company's office-building division. He was appointed the state's director of Federal procurement early in 1959 in the Scranton Administration and served for 2½ years in that post before suffering a heart attack that forced him to give up the position.

WITH HAVERFORD FIRM

For several years Mr. Meadows was active in the suburban real estate field and was associated with the firm of Wheel-

er-Williams, Inc., of Haverford, at the time of his death.

He was a member of the All Saints Episcopal Church in Wynnewood and the Overbrook Golf Club. He is survived by his wife.

Funeral services will be held at the All Saints Church in Wynnewood at 2 P. M. Tuesday, Sept. 23. Interment will be in the Arlington National Cemetery, Arlington, Va.
