McCARATHY, Thomas Joseph
(Joe) Sr. — Requiem Mass for
Mr. McCarthy, 73, of Hinton,
who died Thursday night, will
be sung at 10 a.m. Monday in

gan as celebrant. Burial will
be in Greenbrier Burial Park
at Hinton. Rosary will be re-
cited at 8 p.m. tomorrow in

chapel. The body will remain at
the mortuary until the service.
Mr. McCarthy died in C&O Hos-
pital at Huntington after a
one-month illness. He was a re-
tired Chesapeake and Ohio
Railway conductor and a mem-
ber of the Brotherhood of Rail-
way Trainmen. A native of Ra-
leigh County, he had lived in
Hinton for 55 years. Surviving
are his wife Ella; one son,
Thomas J. McCarthy Jr. of
Huntington; two daughters,
Mrs. Leonard T. Anderson of
Charleston and Miss Mary
Elizabeth McCarthy of Hinton;
one brother, John McCarthy of
Peru, Ind.; one sister, Mrs.
Mary Cunningham of Colum-
bus, Ohio; and four grandchil-
dren.
