FAYE QUESENBERRY DIES IN RICHMOND; RITES INCOMPLETE

Miss Faye Mobley Quesenberry, well known cashier and bookkeeper at the Hub Clothing Company for many years, died today at 2 a. m. in the Johnston-Willis Hospital in Richmond, Va. after a six months illness.

Born at Cliff Top, Fayette county, Miss Quesenberry was a daughter of Mrs. Sally Mobley Quesenberry of this city and the late Dr. George O. Quesenberry. She came to Hinton with her family when quite young, when her father began his practice of medicine here.

She was a graduate of Hinton High School and Virginia Intermont College, Bristol, Va.

Due to the friendly and efficient manner in which she discharged the duties of her job and met the business public, the deceased had many friends and acquaintances.

She was a member of the Central Baptist church and active in civic groups, being a member of the Business and Professional Woman's club and the Hinton Woman's Club.

Besides her mother, survivors include one brother, O. M. Quesenberry of Hinton; three sisters, Mrs. Lois Ferrell of Richmond, Mrs. Gladys Saul and Mrs. Lura Meadows of Hinton; three nephews and one niece.
