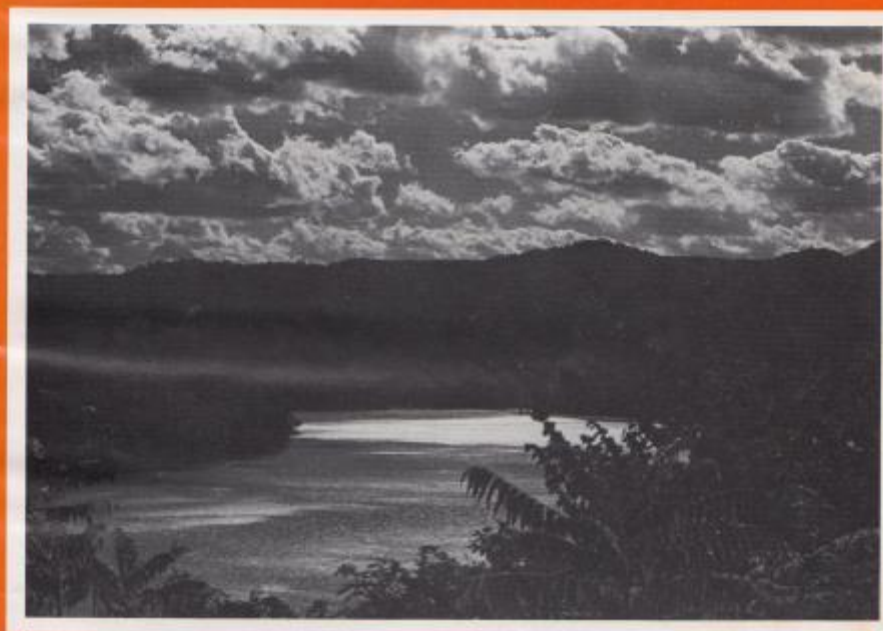

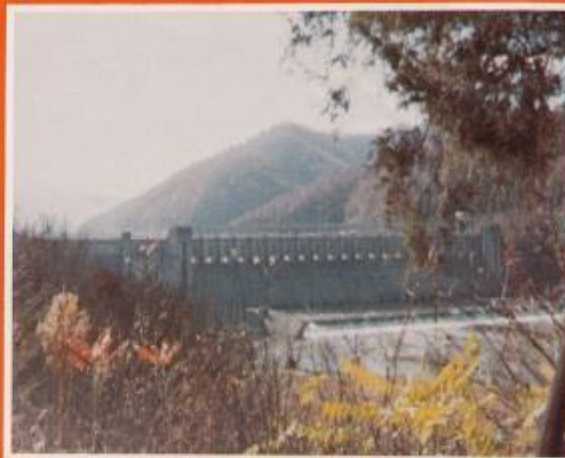

Located in the middle of the city, Hinton High School, has at last count 886 students, 26 classrooms, six offices, auditorium, library, learning lab, two gymnasiums, study hall, shop, band room, cafeteria, and home economics room.

Occupying the six offices is the administration, which includes the principal, two deans, two guidance counselors, and two secretaries. There are 50 teachers who devote their time to instruction, and give up their own spare time to sponsor many extra curricular activities and organizations.

From 8:30 to 3:21 each day, we could join one or more of the 12 clubs, or participate in 10 activities which contribute to the school, take 6 of 64 classes, or attend vocational training at the Summers County Career Center.

But these statistics cannot tell us all of the changes in our school and community; the 1980 Dart does.







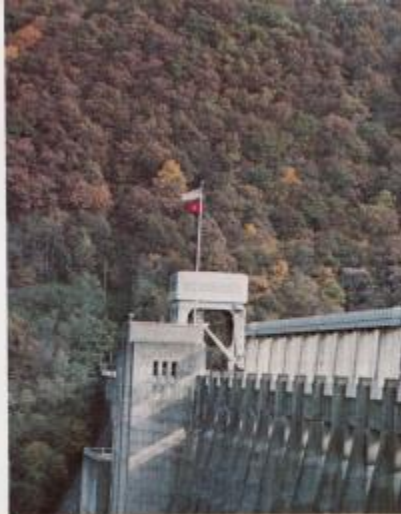

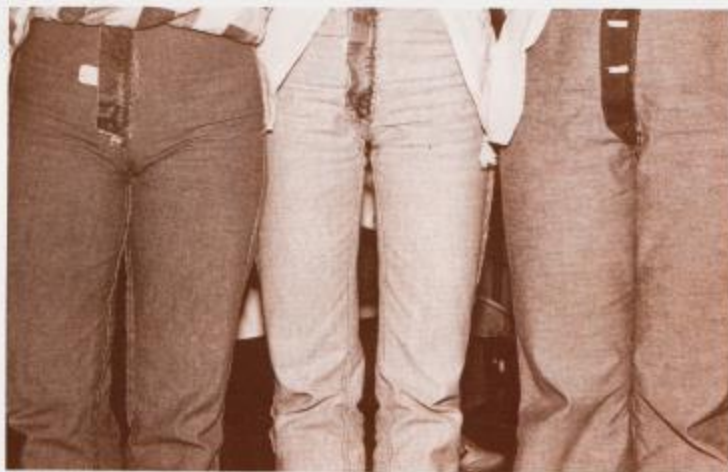


From T-shirts and track shoes, to Candies and skirts with slits, fashions, like everything else, are slowly changing.

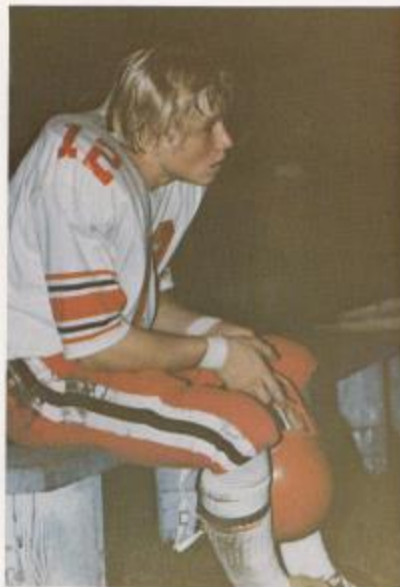

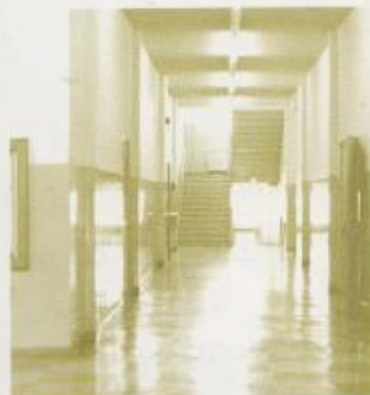
Being a Senior-a time everyone looks forward to, is a year that seems to go by in a flash.

TIME PASSAGES made him tired of this DISCO INFERNO and SLEEPING SINGLE IN A DOUBLE BED.

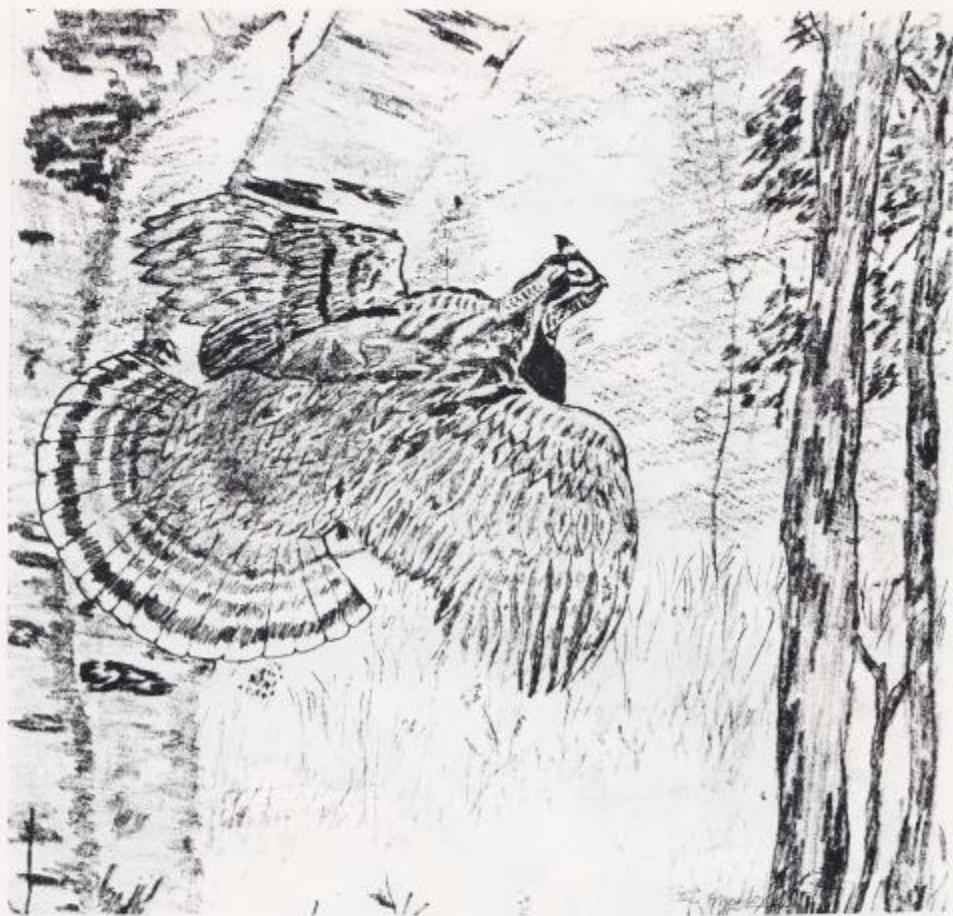

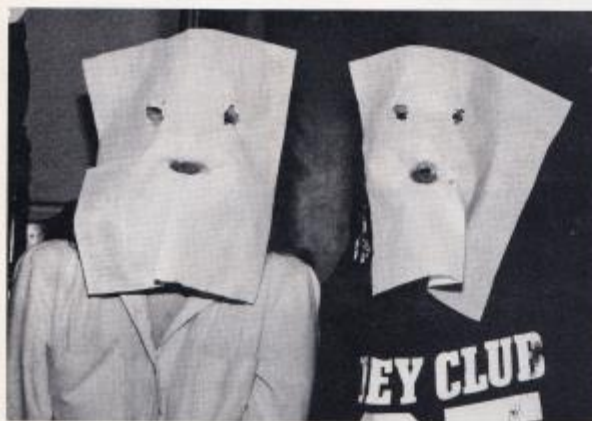
