


Located in the middle of the city, Hinton High School, has at last count 886 students, 26 classrooms, six offices, auditorium, library, learning lab, two gymnasiums, study hall, shop, band room, cafeteria, and home economics room.

Occupying the six offices is the administration, which includes the principal, two deans, two guidance counselors, and two secretaries. There are 50 teachers who devote their time to instruction, and give up their own spare time to sponsor many extra curricular activities and organizations.

But these statistics cannot tell us all of the changes in our school and community; the I980 Dart does.




Coats and jackets are dominated by sweaters, down vests, ski jackets, and varsity coats.

Enjoy years as a student, as the cliche goes "These are the best days of your life."






As we reflect back on the years spent at HHS, we will remember such things as the halls and building and the many honors our school received. All these things will always be a part of our changing lives.

In their efforts to spread spirit, members of the club sold booster badges promoting the various sporting events involving HHS teams.



The problem with me is that a little boy I belong to has torn me all to pieces, and he will probably get a new stocking next year — this is how my story goes.




