



















Keith Vest, a ninth grader, added, "Smaller classes; if there are too many students in a classroom you can't think well." Teachers were also found to think that if there were less people in a class more independent help could be given. Some help for large classes should be found in 1982-83 when classrooms are only supposed to contain up to 25 publis.

Students were also asked in what areas they thought they had been educated the most and the least. English and History were found to be in the majority of being learned the most, but some students even stated that they thought they had been educated properly in all areas. Science and Math were two areas where pupils thought they had been educated the least, mostly because students concluded that these classes weren't very interesting and were harder to learn.

Throughout a students' educational career he will encounter classes in which he will learn more than in others, but if a student, himself, wants to learn and puts forth the effort he will profit from his education.

# Faculty Approves

7 Period Day

"The seven period day enhances our school's curriculum with a wide variety of advantages," responds Connie Newton, HHS English teacher. This statement summarizes the typical response by teachers on the success of the seven period schedule for this school year.

Many teachers find 45 minute classes, the possibility of an expanded curriculum, smaller classes, and split lunches, definite advantages to the seven period day.

The 45 minute class periods relieve teachers of the leftover 5 or 10 wasted minutes usually found in the 55 minute period. "One or two concepts can be answered in 45 minutes" explained one teacher. "The 5 or 10 leftover minutes is not ample time to introduce a new idea" adds another faculty member.

Many teachers also feel that the 45 minute period prevents teachers and students from losing interest in the subject.

Many teachers also feel that the seven period day offers the chance to expand the curriculum. Mrs. Williams, special education teacher, urges faculty participation to develop, "A curriculum to benefit the average student as well as the advanced student." She feels the 7 period day can help accomplish such a goal.

"Split lunches eliminates pushing and crowding seen in the previous lunch schedule", one faculty member adds as an advantage to the seven period day.

Some of the disadvantages cited by the teachers include less time for lab experiments, and the idea of the extra class to teach.

Mr. Persinger explained that 45 minutes is not sufficient time to conduct many Chemistry and Physics experiments.

One faculty member explained that the scheduling problems had nothing to do with the seven period day. One teacher added "I hope that before we abandon the 7 period day, someone will look into ways to handle scheduling."

Mrs. Newton summed up the major reaction saying, "Our present curriculum needs to be revised to suit the demands of a larger class day. Education should not be stagnant," concluded Mrs. Newton.







#### Trainers Make Sports Safer


Many current magazine articles have called football a "deadly game" and have accused many coaches of encouraging unsafe playing techniques. Coach John Curia, however, says "Football is safer today than ever before." He said the State Department of Education and coaching organizations are constantly updating the game to make it safer for the participants.

One of the most notable changes in athletics this year has been the addition of an athletic trainer to the coaching staff of many West Virginia Schools. The State Department has mandated that all high schools in West Virginia employ by 1985 an athletic trainer to be present at all football games and practices. Summers County is one of the first schools in the state to implement a training program.

According to Coach Curia, most high schools already have hired persons who are in the process of becoming qualified trainers. Those schools who have not begun a training program must file a form with the state outlining plans for implementing such a program. The trainer will eventually be required to have a college degree in Physical Education with a specialization in athletic training. Persons presently employed without the degree must continue to work toward this degree to maintain a trainer status, HHS trainer, Ron Stennett, is currently taking courses toward a trainers degree with Jerry Meadows who is the Talcott Junior High trainer.

Mr. Meadows outlines the trainers duties as care, prevention, and treatment of injuries, rehabilitation of injuries, and preseason, inseason, and postseason conditioning for the players. "The most common injuries that the trainer deals with are sprains and muscle pulls," added Mr. Meadows. "One of the most serious injuries we dealt with at Talcott was a broken foot." Coach Curia's most serious injuries were dislocated fingers and sprained ankles. He added, "Last year, however, we had a neck injury in our junior high season. I hope I don't ever have to see one of my players seriously hurt."

In order to determine the treatment for a particular injury, the trainer, explained Mr. Meadows, uses the basic rule, "When in doubt, call a doctor." The trainer's responsibilities lie within basic first aid principles. The treatment of sprains, minor cuts, bruises, etc. can be



treated by the trainer. More serious complications are referred to a doctor.

In addition to basic treatment of injuries the trainer has the authority to prohibit a player from participating if any injury is too serious. In past year's the coach opted to leave a player out or send him into the game. Coach Curia pointed out that he now relies on the trainer's judgement to whether a player is well enough to play or not. Mr. Meadows explained that before many coaches might encourage a player to go back into the game because he was needed inspite of his injury. For this reason the State Department has recommended that coaches not be trainers too.


Both Coach Curia and Mr. Meadows agree that the training program will eventually be expanded to all sports programs. Educators realize that safety is more and more a primary concern in high school athletic competition.




















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
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
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#### ACKNOWLEDGEMENT
