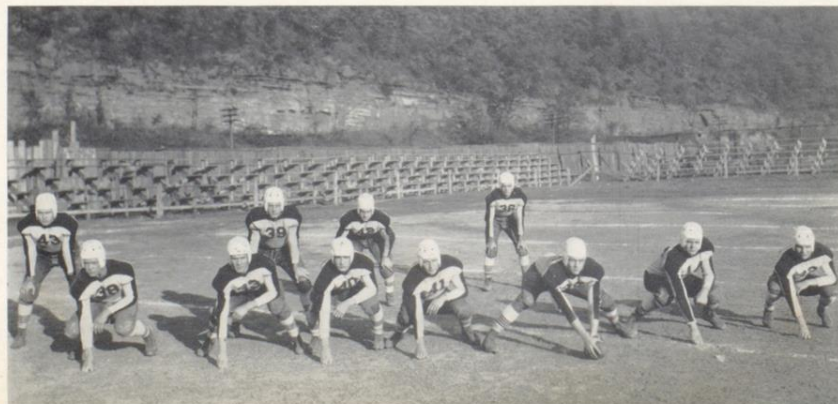
RESUME

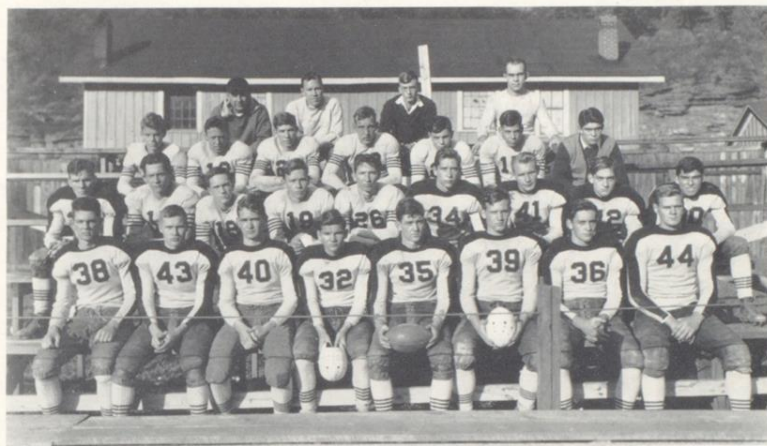
Shadows of 1937, the immortal year of the state championship, haunted the Bobcat football campaign of 1938, contriving to keep alive in the hearts of the team's famously rabid disciples a vision of a repeat on the title until the collapse of the dream when Johnny Worth's third Hinton eleven stumbled on the second from last rung of the ladder.

Charleston, East Bank and Beckley provided the starlit spots along the road. Charleston, because its favored Mountain Lions, failed for the second time to humble the Bobcats and gave up a 7-7 tie. East Bank because its Pioneers, amid the clamor of an Armistice Day celebration, tripped the Hinton eleven in full flight and sent the vision tumbling. Beckley because while anvil choruses rank the ivy-covered Thanksgiving game was postponed for the first time in history—and because the Bobcats wrote their fins over the Flying Eagles in blazing letters.

Starting their fourth year since ascendancy of that town spirit shot with white heat, skeptical of the chances of their remnant team, Bobcat disciples watched the steamroller start its crushing roll and climbed aboard. Alderson was the opening day victim, 19-0. Then Charleston, tied. After that, Richwood, 19-6. Mt. Hope, 13-0, and a deluge over Trap Hill, 85-0. Oak Hill came, strong as always, and in the process of being trampled 25-0, staged what Hinton outspokenly called an outrageous display of unsportsmanly conduct. Result: Long-standing Bobcat-Red Devil relations were quietly severed.

Still on the glory road, the Bobcats were topped in the minds of state experts by other teams, yet the disciples figuratively bared their teeth at the handicappers and counted audaciously on another

undefeated season. Results along the Bobcats' trail in the next two weeks upheld them. Hinton topped Princeton, 45-0, turned back Matewan, 32-0.

Veins of the Bobcats still ran red with money-player blood. They won like thoroughbreds with the chips down, coasted like platers in the easy runs. The strain inherent since 1936 was still there.

Came Armistice Day, dressed in a star-spangled Legion fete. And came East Bank, with the usual special train and confident mob. Hinton scored first, missed the extra point. The Pioneers caught the Bobcats back on their heels in the last two minutes, slipped over a touchdown and a point to win 7-6.

Heartbreak ruled and the props collapsed under the championship dream. Johnny Worth to his gloom-soaked gridders: "The world hasn't come to an end."

Thanksgiving came and went without a Hinton-Beckley game for the first time in 15 years. The fair weather of two months stepped out and snow, rain, sleet struck. In the face of a storm of criticism, Hinton school officials postponed the game until the following Saturday, an unprecedented action. The rest is history. With a bit of the color, the glamour and spirit gone, the game went on. Hinton scored once, bottled up the Beckley eleven, won 6-0.

Sixth place in the state rankings was the lot of the ex-champions, once tied, once defeated. The North-South game, state's all-star spectacle, called Charles "Fatty" Harris, whom the season made a Bobcat great; Bobby Dodd, meteoric young halfback who flashed to glory beside Harris; and Ernest Parry, unheadlined, a blocking back. They helped the South win 9-0.

Harris was lauded as the state's greatest lineman, won state and conference award after award, attained the first all-state team. Dodd was honored with second all-state team ranking, Parry and Charley Haynes, Bobcat end, with honorable mention.

Lights out on schoolboy football for Harris, Dodd, Parry, Haynes; Joe Hinerman, a godsend back up from Kentucky; William Stone, center; Bus Tyree, end; Raymond Jackson, guard. Left in the line-up were Paul Phillips, back; Ralph Vass, tackle; Basil Gill, guard; and promising substitutes.

Johnny Worth rode high again, up in the vanguard of West Virginia high school coaches, borne on an envious record of one undefeated season in three, one state championship, 23 wins, three defeats, three ties. Paul E. Smith, builder of lines, chief scout, bowled through his second year on the staff—more than ever the popular valued assistant to the master. Robert "Bun" Goff moulded the stars of tomorrow on the Junior High School squad.

No championship there, in that season's tale, yet 1938 earned its own shadow to cast.

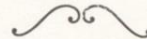
