Sandstone Coach Dies Of Injuries

HINTON, Aug. 21 (RNS)-Marvin Lawrence Shull Jr., 29, athletic coach at Sandstone High School died late this evening.

Shull, better known as "Sugar", had been unconscious in the Hinton Hospital since he was admitted Saturday afternoon following an auto accident.

He received a broken right leg, broken jaw, brain concussion and internal injuries in a two-car collision on W. Va. 3 at nearby Lowell.

Julian G. Fredeking Jr., 34, Hinton businessman, was driving the car in which Shull was riding. He is in critical condition. He was transferred to a Huntington hospital today.

Shull was the son of J. L. Shull Sr., and Elizabeth Anderson Shull of Main Street, Hinton. They are his only immediate survivors.

Born at Glen Wilton, Va., Aug. 15, 1927, he had been a resident of Hinton since 1936.

The victim had just started his third year as coach at Sandstone. He was graduated from Concord College and taught two years in Summers County schools before accepting the coaching position. H served 18 months in the Army, part of which was spent in the Aleutian Islands.

The body is at the E. M. Meadows Funeral Home pending completion of funeral arrangements.

Cecil Canterbury of Mount Hope, driver of the car which collided with the Fredeking vehicle, posted bond on a reckless driving charge Monday before Magistrate U. G. Ryalls. A member of the Air Force, he was slightly injured in the collision.

Opl. Glen Starcher of the State Police said Canterbury will be charged with manslaughter.
