Dr. Ford, 68, Of Beckley, Heart Victim

BECKLEY — A prominent Beckley physician died apparently of a heart attack Wednesday at his farm at Talcott-Wayside on the Summers-Monroe County line.

Dr. Scott A. Ford, 68, resided at 106 Prince St. He served as a coal company doctor at Edwight before opening a private practice here several years ago.

He was born at Talcott, a son of the late Bruce and Rispie Wilson Ford.

He attended Marshall and West Virginia Universities. He interned at St. Luke's Hospital in Richmond and graduated from the Medical College of Virginia there in 1932.

He was a member of the Raleigh County Medical Society, American and Southern medical associations, Beckley Presbyterian Church and the Masonic and Elks lodges.

He had served as both coroner and health officer for Raleigh County for a number of years.

Survivors include his wife, Gladys Malcom Ford; daughters, Scottie Marie at home, Mrs. David Humphreys of Charlotte, N. C.; sisters, Mrs. James Sims of Ronceverte, Mrs. E. C. Graham of Alderson, Mrs. Roscoe Whitlock of Ashland, Ky., Mrs. Ralph Webb of Carlisle; brothers, Herman of Hilltop and the Rev. George Ford of Talcott.

Service will be held Friday at 2 p. m. in Melton Funeral Home here, with the Rev. Jack Sadler officiating. Cremation will follow, with burial in Sherwood Memorial Park at Salem, Va.
