## Robert Price 'Bob' Meador

GLENWOOD – Robert Price 'Bob' Meador, 81, a resident of the Glenwood community, passed away Sunday, Dec. 14, 2003 at his home.

Born Jan. 15, 1922, in Hinton, Summers County, he was preceded in death by his parents, Larkin and Ruth Price Meador and his younger brother, Lark.

He attended public schools in Hinton and in 1943 was inducted into the United States Army. He served in Europe with the 580th Anti-Aircraft Battalion until his discharge in 1946. Afterwards he attended the West Virginia Institute of **Technology in Montgomery** and graduated with a degree in printing. While there he met and married Margaret Moore of Hinton, who was teaching in Montgomery. They were married there on April 3, 1947.

Following graduation from college, he worked for a time in Columbus, Ohio before moving to the Bluefield area in 1951. He was employed as an engraver with the Bluefield Daily Telegraph for a brief time and later worked over 25 years as a clerk for the United States Postal Service in Bluefield until his retirement. His wife, Margaret, a professor emeritus of West Virginia University, served for many years as Mercer County's Extension Home Economics agent. The couple has resided in the Glenwood community for 52 vears.

Bob was noted for his varied interests, two of which included chess and woodcarving. He combined these two interests, for many years, by designing and carving chess sets. He also enjoyed designing and making hand carved jewelry and decorative objects. He was a lifelong environmentalist and after retirement he served as a volunteer 4-H leader and as a volunteer with the Mercer County **Retired Senior Volunteer** Program. In his later years, despite failing evesight, he maintained an interest in world affairs and reading, utilizing recorded books. He was an accomplished Scrabble player and spent countless hours with his family playing this game that gave him so much

enjoyment in his latter years.

Survivors include his wife, Margaret; son, James Meador of Plant City, Fla., son, Michael of Asheville, N.C., and daughter, Lora of Frederick, Md.; five grand-children and three great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at 1 p.m. Wednesday from the Burns Wornal Chapel of the Memorial Funeral Directory on the Athens Road in Princeton with the Rev. Nancy Cale officiating. Burial will follow in the Roselawn Memorial Gardens on the Courthouse Road in Princeton.
