## Miss Youell Shoots Self

No Motive For Suicide Known
Death Was Almost
Instant

All Hinton was shocked last right by the tragic death of Miss Margaret Youell, well known local girl, from a self-inflicted bullet wound at 8 o'clock last night. Miss Youell's death came within a few minutes after the bullet was fired. She was gasping her last when Dr. G. L. Pence arrived at her bedside.

No cause for the young girl's tash act has been definitely found. It is said that family troubles were the most probable cause.

Throughout the day-she had been in her room nearly all the time. Just before' the 'shooting she was seen outside, apparently in the best of spirits. A few moments afterwards she was sound lying in her room with the blood flowing from a gunshot wound through the teft breast above and to the right of the heart.

The young girl was a member of this year's normal class at the local High School. She had finished the usual acedemic course with the class of 1921, and was the center of a large circle of friends.

The dead girl was 18 years old, and is survived by her father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. H. P. Youell; one sister, Nell, and two brothers, Harry and James.

The funeral services will be held Sunday at 2:30 at the First Baptist Church, Rey. G. H. Payne will officiate. Burial will be made at Hilltop Cemetery.

The sad occurrence caused much excitement in the city last night. A large crowd of people had gathered at the scene within a few moments after the shooting. Squire W. F. Argabright, acting as coroner, was admitted to the house a few mements after the shot had been fired, and stated that there was no necessity for an inquest. Death he stated officially, was due to a self inflicted gunshot wound.
