Lula Meador Dies At 81

HINTON (RNS) — Mrs. Lula A. Meador, 81, died Tuesday afternoon in a Hinton hospital after a long illness.

Born in Hinton, July 31, 1893, she was a daughter of the late F. R. and Catherine Abbitt Early.

She was a lifelong resident of Hinton, was graduated from Hinton High School, Shepherd College and she taught school in Hinton for 20 years.

Mrs. Meador was a member of the United Methodist Church, taught Joy Class and Sunday School for 40 years, was a charter member and past president of the Hinton Woman's Club, past president of Delphia Club, past president of the Wednesday Club, was a member of the United Daughters of the Confederacy, Daughters of American Revolution, Grace Allen Circle of the King's Daughters and was a historian for the West Virginia Federation of Women's Clubs.

Her husband, Dr. A. T. Meador, died in 1973.

Survivors include one sister, Miss Elinor Early of Hinton, and one niece and one nephew.

Services will be at 2 p.m. Thursday at Ronald Meadows Funeral Home in Hinton with Rev. John L. Smith and Rev. Howard Baccus in charge. Burial will be in the Greenbrier Burial Park.
