Funeral services for Charles J. Bowling, Hinton, will be conducted at 2 p. m. Sunday in the Brooklyn Methodist Church, near Hinton.

Burial will be in Restwood Memorial Estates.

Bowling, 35-year-old brakeman, was killed instantly when he fell under the wheels of a train at Montgomery about 1:15 p. m. Thursday.

Reports indicate Bowling was engaged in a switching operation when he was thrown from the train and under a railway car.

Chesapeake and Ohio Railway officials are investigating the accident.

Born at Brooklin, Raleigh County, he was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Nathan E. Bowling.

A graduate of Hinton High School, he was a veteran of World War II, a member of the Brooklin Methodist Church and the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen.

Other survivors include his wife, the former Virginia Lively; three sons, Roger, Ronald and Keith, and two daughters, Sandra and Brenda, all at home, and a brother, Nathan E. Bowling Jr. of Hinton.
