





The school day starts way before the first bell at 8:10 in the morning. At the crack of dawn, some students are already up eating breakfast or possibly waiting to catch their buses. By 7:00 the janitors are already at school getting everything ready for the upcoming day. They're here making sure that everything is in proper order before the students arrive. The administration also starts work before the opening bell. They arrive at the school between 7:30 and 8:00. If you would walk through the school, you would find teachers at their desks making final adjustments to their lesson plans for the



Homeroom begins at 8:20 and lasts until 8:25. Within this time, roll is taken and announcements are made by a member of the administration, student council, or Spoken English. The announcementa basically consist of upcoming meetings, adjustments with class schedules, etc.

After the first period bell rings at 8:35 everything is pretty well routine. The 8:35 bell begins the first of the eight periods. Each period is separated into 55 minute intervals with 5 minutes between periods so that the students can go to their lockers and return to their next class. Usually students return to the same classes day after day, except for the seventh graders. The seventh graders are required to take a cluster class. The cluster class is where students study one subject for six weeks then move on to another. Some of the classes studied are art, creative writing, library, P.E., and home ec.

The school provides classes for almost every field of interest, from P.E. to physics. Hinton has





all the classes required by the state not to mention a numerous selection of electives. A student is required to have 4 years of English, 3 years of History, 1 year of P.E., and 1 year of Health before graduating. As for electives the school has Art, Foreign Languages, Advanced math and science courses.

Hinton also has a career center which provides career courses not only for Hinton High but also Meadow Bridge. These courses include nursing, welding, home ec., etc ...

Every senior high student looks forward to 11:10, just as junior high students wait for 12:00. Most students consider this time the most important of the whole day, for this is when students and teachers get to satisfy their growling atomachs - lunch. Hinton High, unlike most high schools, has open campus. That means students are allowed to leave the school's property to go down town to eat. This gives students and teachers a great variety of places to eat.

Most of the students that eat downtown go either to the Corner Restaurant or the Hot Dog Stand. Those who know someone who can drive or if they can drive themselves, they can expand their choices to a number of places outside of town such as Pizza Hut or the Dairy Queen. But we can't forget about the great food that is provided by the school cafeteria. Each day the cafeteria workers prepare close to 250 lunches, consisting of meat, vegetables, fruit, bread, and many times dessert.





School is not all work. There is some time set aside for just getting together. There are ten minutes before homeroom for students to catch up on the latest gossip. There are also five minutes between classes so that students can go to their lockers, get their books, and hang around with their friends. All together there are 45 minutes set aside for the students to unwind, so school isn't all work.

The principal also sets up times that students can get out of class and assemble in the auditorium for special programs. These programs include pep assemblies, and awards assemblies, and perhaps occasionally a concert. These assemblies enable students to relax and think of other things besides English, math, and science. It also gives the teachers a bit of a rest from their daily routine.



#### Lee Ann Goins


If you see someone carrying a doll, a mathematics book, a camera, a "straight A" report card, and wearing skiis, chances are it's Lee Ann Godns!





"Tackle by Hellems" At any Hinton football game this will be commonly heard over the loudspeaker.


Jack Hellems, who has played football for four years led his team in tackles his Jr. year. His talents can be clearly seen on the field and his skills have earned him "player of the week" twice.




#### «Joe Woodrum








#### ⊀Melissa Trainum













The making of a varsity football player doesn't just take place from August to November. As soon as the cleats and jerseys are hung up, they retreat to a place called the Bobcat Body Shop or more commonly the weight room. They work with weights all year round to prepare themselves to "crack heads" with their opponents from September to November. All those hot and

miserable August days are spent on the practice field going through rugged agility drills. In early August the players hit the field at 8:00 in the morning and practice until 11:00, when they get a break for lunch. Then after lunch, it's back to the hot sun and dusty practice field until 3:00 that evening.





Coach John Curia in his fifth year as head coach of the Bobcats says," It takes a lot of hard work and determination on the players behalf to put together a winning team."

This years winning 7 and 3 season was contributed to a hard hitting line, and a quick backfield.

Leading the team in offensive rushing yards was Jr. fullback Timmy Bugg, with 132 carries for 789 total rushing yards, with an average of 5.98 yards per carry. Felix Wynes, the Bobcat left half back was second with 79 carries for 557 total yards, averaging 7 yards per carry. Then senior right halfback, Jackie Hellems was third with 55 carries for 395 yards, averaging 7.18 yards per carry.

All of this would not be possible if it weren't for the unsung heros of the game, the linemen. Their responsibilities are to open holes in the line and to protect the backs. This years linemen position was led by John Diaz, who did a very fine job. Whenever the Bobcats needed yardage up the middle they could always count on Mitch Bowling, Howard Hilton, John Diaz, Tariq Shamma, and Roger Hodge.


















