













Dr. J. W. Stokes Dedication




Welcome to Bobcat Country!

A Half Century Of Football









For over 50 years Bobcat football teams have experienced either victory or defeat at what was once known as Avis Field. It was later dedicated to Dr. J. W. Stokes after he helped to finance the stadium fence. The 1977 senson is expected to be the last season played at Stokes Stadium ending with a 4-6 record. 




Last Word
