Jack D. Thompson, Former Teacher And Principal

Jack David Thompson, vice principal of Schofield Middle School, died Saturday at an Aiken County hospital.

Mr. Thompson, 53, resided at 734 Two Notch Road.

Funeral services will be Wednesday at 5 p.m. at Millbrook Baptist Church with the Rev. W. James Rivers officiating. Entombment will be in Hinton, W. Va.

Mr. Thompson, a native of Hinton, lived in Aiken for the past 20 years. He was a son of the late Charles David and Daisy Lilly Thompson. He was a member of Millbrook Baptist Church and a Sunday school teacher of the Co-Ed Adult Sunday School Class. He re-

ceived a bachelor's degree from Concord College in Athens, W. Va., and a master's degree from the University of Georgia.

Mr. Thompson was a former teacher at Aiken High School and Silver Bluff High School. He was a former principal of Millbrook Elementary School and was formerly on the administration board of the Aiken County School District. At the time of his death, he was vice principal of Schofield Middle School. He was a member of the State Teachers Association, and he taught adult night classes in Aiken. He was a veteran of the Korean War in the United States Air Force.

James A. Taylor, a former principal of Aiken High School, said, "He was a very dedicated, loyal, and professional individual. He was a model for everyone as an administrator and a teacher. He was always thinking about the people he served. Those who will miss him most are all of the students he served right up to the time of his death. It's a great loss."

Survivors include his widow, Mary David Thompson; two daughters, Lynn Thompson Melton, Aiken, and Sarah Thompson, Aiken; two sons, David Michael Thompson, U.S. Air Force, Denver, Colo., and Eric Lance Thompson, Aiken; two sisters, Mrs. Danny Lilly, Beckley, W. Va, and Mrs. Jack Ashley, Hinton; two brothers, Kenneth Thompson, Green Sulphur Spring, W. Va., and Ronald Mack Thompson, Beckley.
