She served 56 consecutive years as an election poll worker. The greatest role she filled, however, was that of a wonderful mother and homemaker. Quilting, flowers, birds, and gardens were a few of her passions. She had a particular fondness for hummingbirds. She was an excellent seamstress.

Jean was a great conversationalist and her door was always open to visitors. She opened her home and reached out to several young people who lived with her from time to time.
