The funeral of Harry Edward (Ned) Hoover, 49, of Oak Hill, formerly of Hinton, will be at 2 p. m. Thursday in the Central Baptist Church at Hinton with the Rev. W. R. McCoy in charge. Burial will be in Restwood Memorial Estates.

Hoover died at 8:10 p. m. Monday in a Beckley hospital of a cerebral hemorrhage.

Born in Hinton, Dec. 24, 1922, he was a son of Harry M. and Edith Mayes Hoover of Hinton.

He had lived in Oak Hill for 20 years and was employed as a signalman for the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Co.

Hoover was a member of the Signalmen's Union, a veteran of World War II and a member of the Central Baptist Church in Hinton.

Other survivors include his wife, June Ayers Hoover; two sons, Gary Layne and William Keith Hoover, and two daughters, Vickie Lynn and Terry Lee, all at home.
