The Dart 1920 - 1929

The Dart was a publication of the school with the first issue published Dec. 21, 1911. It was a small 18 page booklet, six pages devoted to ads, cost ten cents. It was the brainchild of City Superintendent of Schools, Howard F. Fleshman. He was city Superintendent from 1901 to 1904 and was re-appointed in Sept. 1911. At that time we had a city school system and a county system. Fleshman named the publication. The first year five issues were published with a final and larger booklet, termed the "Year Book." It had 25 pages and was much like the present Dart. After a few years the monthly issues stopped, possibly in 1918 because of the war and it became the annual yearbook in 1920.

Normal Department Seniors

During the 1920s Hinton High School had a “Normal” Department which functioned as a “Normal” school.

A “Normal” school is a school created to train high school graduates to be teachers. Its purpose is to establish teaching standards or “norms”, hence its name.

The students in the “Normal” Department were most often graduates from the prior school year. They returned to school as “Normal” Seniors and earned their teaching certificate. Class size ranged from six to ten students.

The following page is an excerpt from the 1923 Dart and it better describes the “Normal” Department.

T H E D A R T

Normal Training

THE Normal training offered in our own school is a great advantage to those who wish to become teachers. After completing this course, one is granted a certificate by the State which enables one to teach for a period of six years.

A standard two-year course grants a life certificate. After the short normal course has been completed, it is usually necessary to attend a standard Normal School for one winter term or two summer terms in order to get this certificate. If one holds a certificate of this classification, even after a period of retirement from the teaching profession, one may again enter the teachers' ranks upon the presentation of this certificate without the necessity of more training.

The practical value of the Normal is shown when we know that twenty graduates are teaching this year, each receiving Ninety Dollars (\$90.00) or more each month.

Teachers should set for themselves the task of moulding public sentiment as well as training the children.

No teacher should be dormant but should embrace every opportunity to grow into a better instructor and thus be more able to do efficiently the work in which she is engaged. Such a teacher would hold to this creed:

"I believe in boys and girls, the men and women of a great tomorrow; that whatsoever the boy soweth the man shall reap. I believe in the curse of ignorance, in the efficacy of schools, in the dignity of teaching, and in the joy of serving others. I believe in wisdom as revealed in human lives as well as in the pages of a printed book, in lessons taught, not so much by precept as by example, in ability to work the hands as well as to think with the head, in everything that makes life large and lovely. I believe in beauty in the school room, in the home, in daily life and in out-of-doors. I believe in laughter, in love, in faith, in all ideals and distant hopes that lure us on. I believe that every hour of every day we receive a just reward for all we are and all we do. I believe in the present and its opportunities, in the future and its promises and in the divine joy of living.

Amen."






GIRLS' BASKETBALL TEAM

Hinton High School Student Clubs and Organizations 1920 - 1929

In the 1920s Hinton High School had very few non-scholastic activities for the students. Focus was primarily on education and as a designated “Normal” school, they offered an additional year of instruction for students seeking a certificate in teaching.

In the early years, the students participated in Literary competitions. By the middle to later part of the 1920s extra curricular activities expanded into Drama, Foreign Language, and fraternity type clubs such as the Hi-Y, and the Girl Reserves.

The staff for the school’s newspaper, “Orange and Black”, first appeared in the 1925 Dart.

The four winners of the preliminary contest went to Montgomery on March 30, where they contested against representatives from Montgomery, Ronceverte, and Mount Hope. The Hinton team made the best showing of any as we carried off half of the honors. Augusta Johnson easily won the Essay and Dorothy Daly proved to be the best orator. Virginia Bowling and Hallie Grimmett, though they did not take first place, were unanimously given second and were only beaten by a very narrow margin.

The winner will represent the district in the state contest to be held at West Virginia University.






The Dramatic Club


We stand for a three-fold development, mentally, morally, and socially.


