Pfc. Fitzpatrick

Killed Nov. 9th

Mr. and Mrs. Kelly P. Fitzpatrick, of Hinton, were advised Thursday that their son Pfc. Phillip Fitzpatrick, 20, who had previously been reported missing in action, was killed in Germany on November 9, 1944.

The telegram from Major General J. A. Ulio, adjutant general of the army, stated:

"I am deeply distressed to inform you corrected report just received states your son, Pfc. Phillip Fitzpatrick, who was previously reported missing in action was killed in action on November 9 (1944) in Germany. The secretary of war asks that I express his deep sympathy in your loss and his regret that unavoidable circumstances made necessary the unusual lapse of time in reported your son's death to you. Confirming letter follows."

Pfc. Fitzpatrick was born on March 30, 1925. He volunteered for service and was inducted into the army on June 1, 1943.

Prior to his induction he was employed by Wilson & Co. here.

Besides his parents, a brother and sister survive.
