Stewart Maurice Sullivan Jr., 80, of Aberdeen, N.C., formerly of Shawnee, Kan., went to be with the Lord at 7:54 a. m. Friday, June 29, 2001, at Moore Regional Hospital, Pinehurst, N.C., following a short illness.
