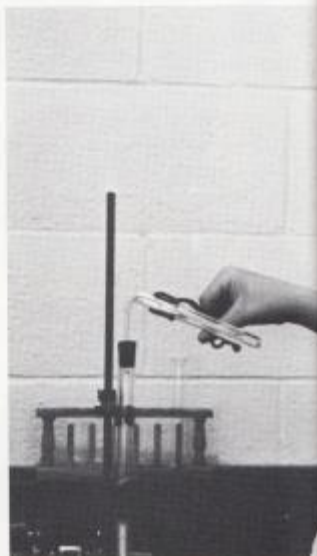

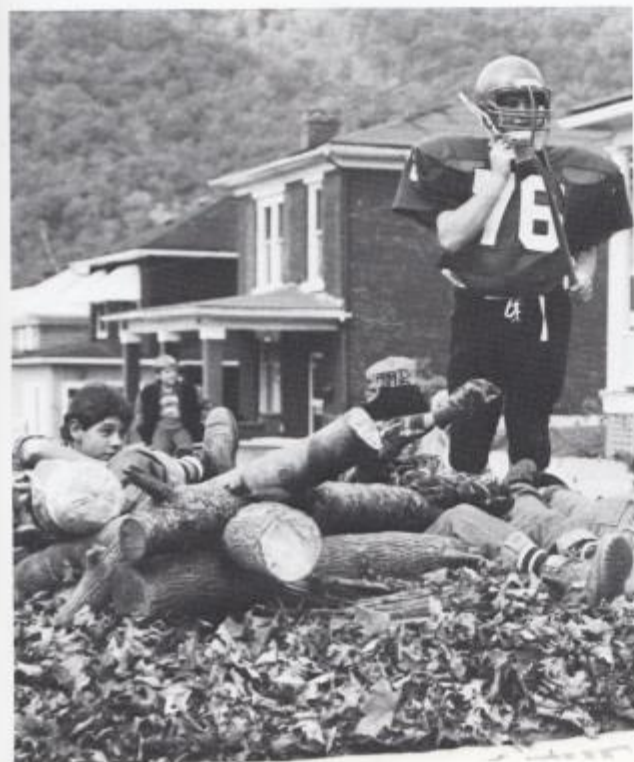

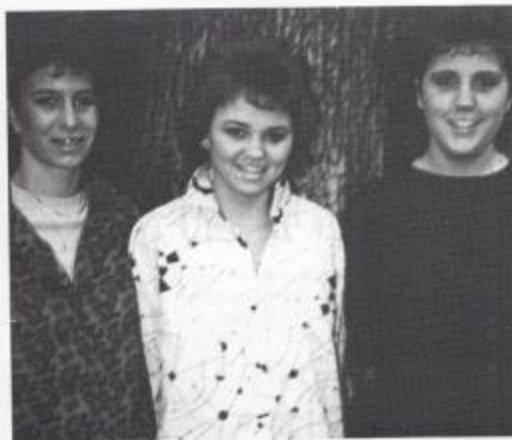

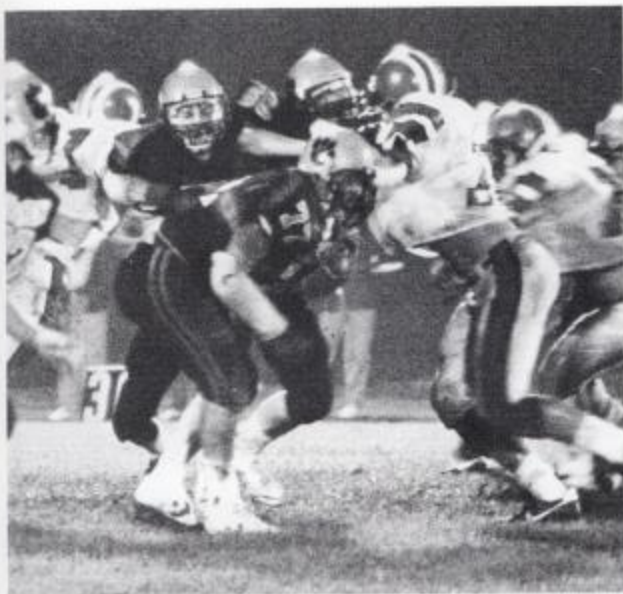

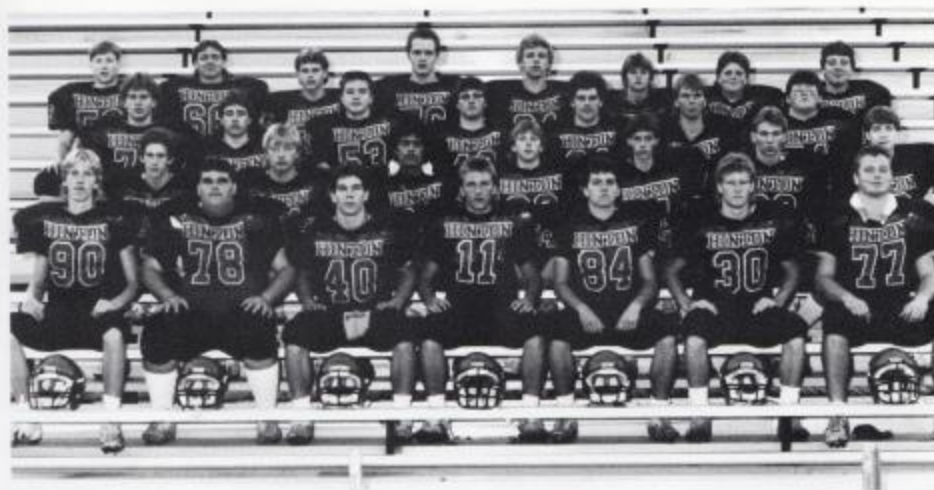

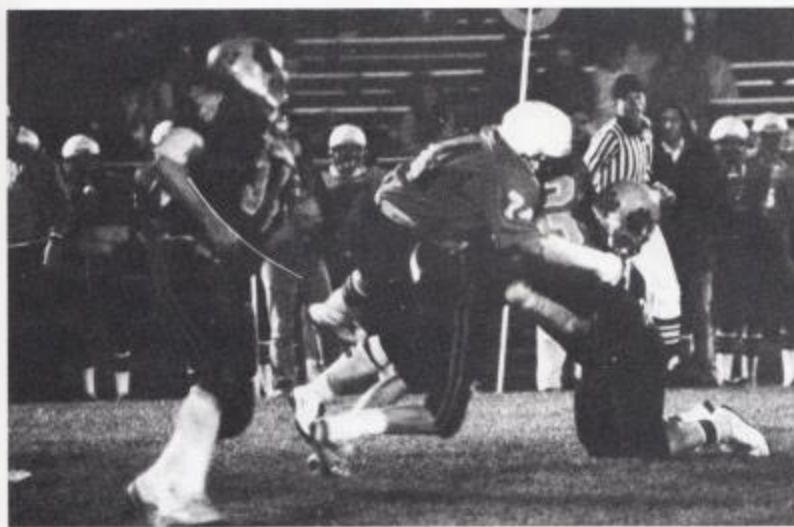

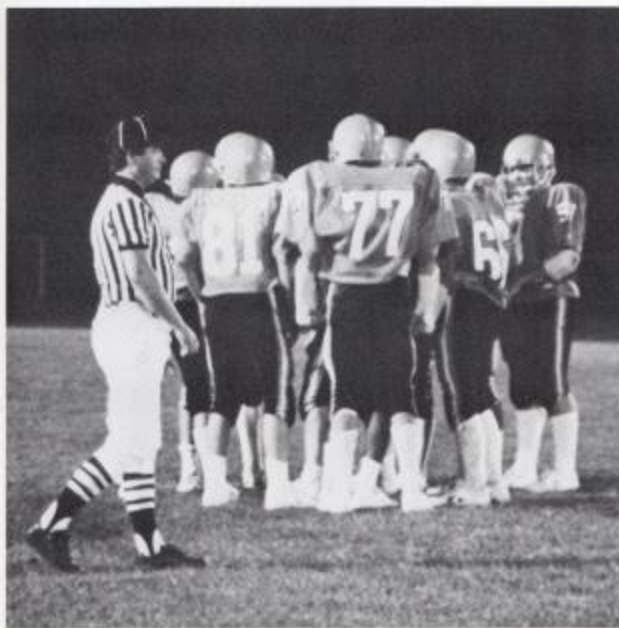

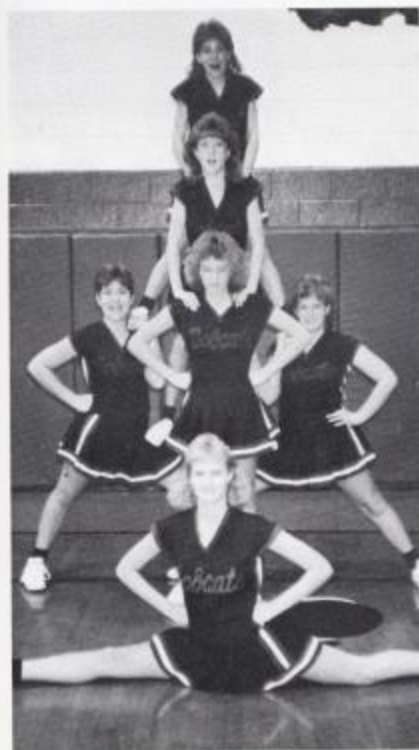

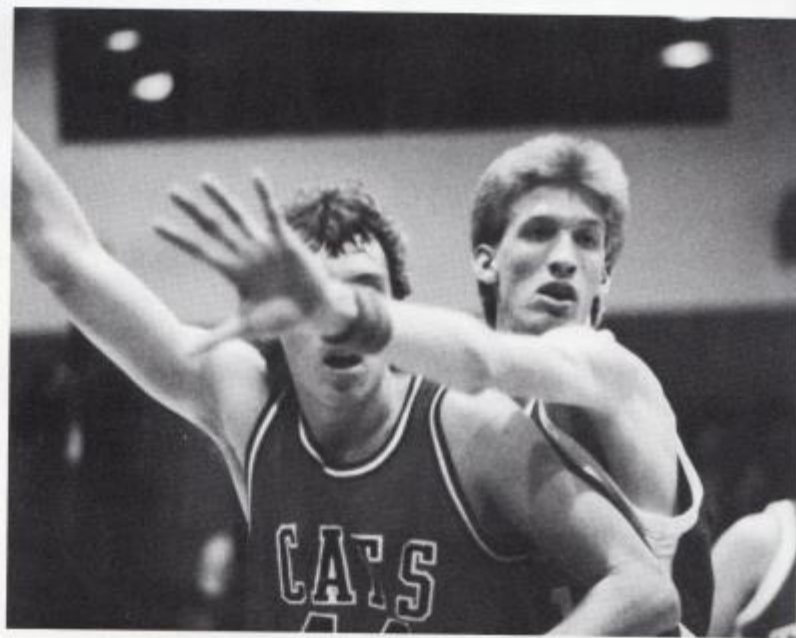
Winning games against Liberty, Independence, Mullens, and Meadow Bridge gave Hinton a 4-2 record as the Dart was mailed to the publisher.

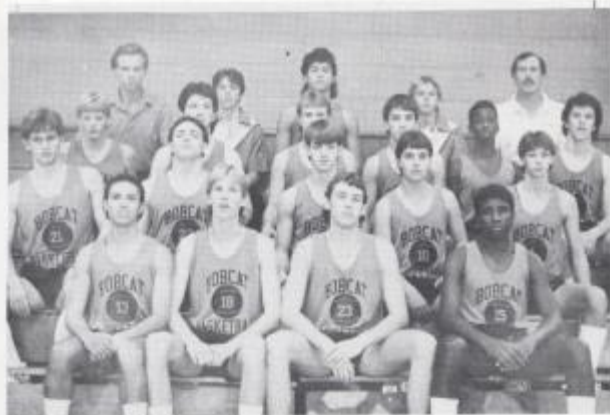

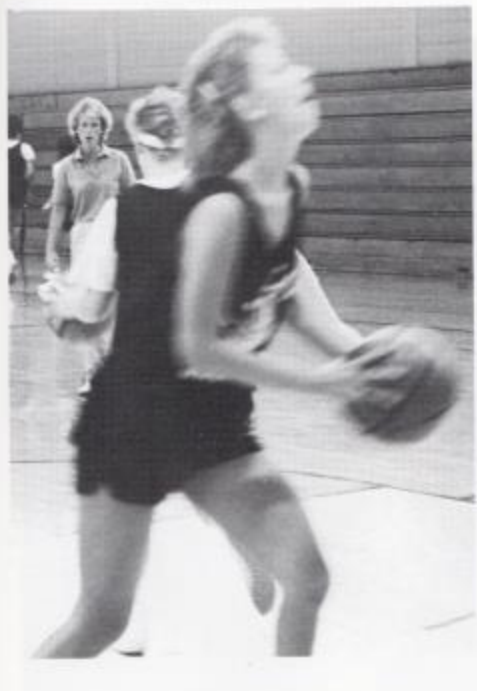

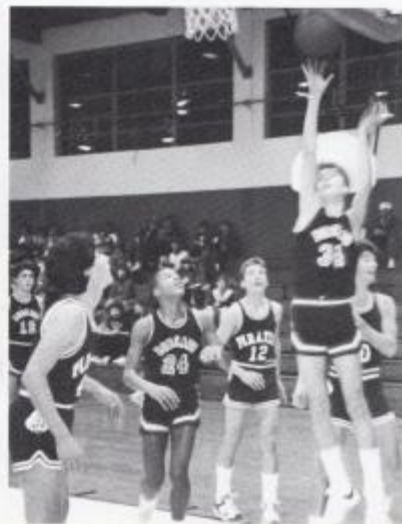

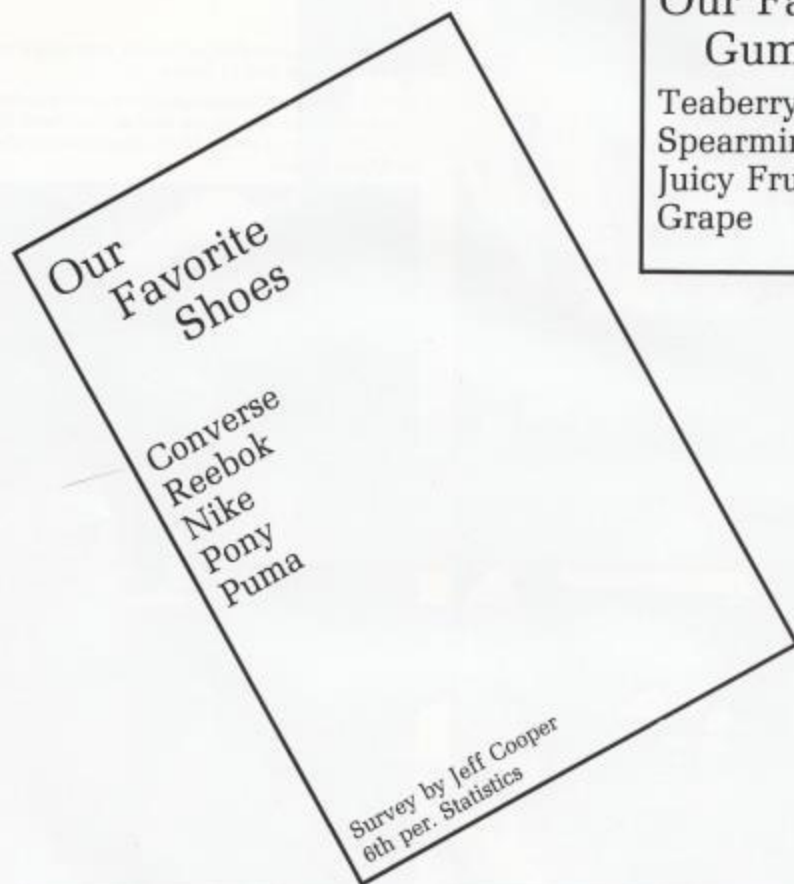

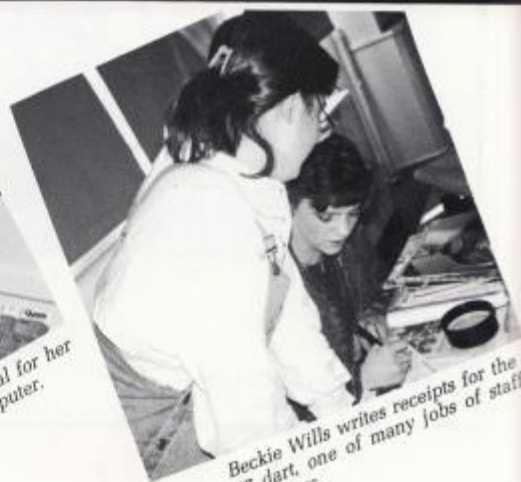
