




Guidance to Success

Two 16 mm projectors, four sound filmstrip projectors and five cassette recorders were also added, not to mention all the new books and newspapers which includes USA Today.

















Football Wins Two






The Jr.High Football team had an average season this year defeating Meadow Bridge 54-0, Pineville 20-0, and Peterstown 26-14.








Winning games against Liberty, Independence, Mullens, and Meadow Bridge gave Hinton a 4-2 record as the Dart was mailed to the publisher.
























