

















"The Good Times ...



As well, picnic tables were put on the old Central Playground for students to eat lunch and to use the space for something other than a parking lot.









"I didn't think it was so complicated. It requires alot of thought, creativeness, and work," smiles a member of the DART staff. "Alot of work!"







Pick up your pen and write your name. Now, put your pen in your other hand (the one you don't normally use) and write your name again. Notice the way your brain has to concentrate to manage this task. Now you know a little bit about how it feels to have a learning disability.

You didn't suddenly forget your name when you changed hands to write it. And you didn't drop 20 or 30 points from your IQ either. But if someone now judged your intelligence on the basis of your weak, maybe even illegible writing, he might think you were stupid.

You are not considered stupid for this and nor are students with learning disabilities stupid. Students with learning disabilities must force their brain to concentrate in the same way you had to concentrate in order to write your name. This is not stupidity; it is a learning disorder which can be overcome. Part of our special education department works to help students who have learning disabilities. The other part of our special education department is the gifted program.


The gifted class is a program designed for students with a high intelligence and a gifted talent (artist, writer, etc.). As a member of the gifted class students are enrolled in advanced classes and participate in extensive educational trips (In 1982 students attended the World's Fair.)





A Dedicated Bobcat



Even though Jack Weaver has been through all of this he still has found time to be an active member of the Bobcat Boosters, who are always doing something to benefit the Bobcats.





Although the 1986 Golf Team barely had enough participants to make a team, they found themselves just 5 strokes away from the State Championships.


