CARBON MONOXIDE FUMES ARE FATAL TO CHARLES LOWE

Pvt. Charles David Lowe, 21, of Nimitz, stationed with the U. S. Army at Fort Eustis, Va., died at 3:55 p.m. in the Hinton Hospital where he had been a patient since Monday morning.

Lowe, who was on a six day leave from duty, was found unconscious in a car Monday on the Leatherwood Road. Hospital authorities said death was attributed to carbon monoxide poisoning.

Born Dec. 9, 1940, at Jumping Branch, he was a son of Paul and Ruth Vest Lowe of Nimitz and had lived all his life in the Jumping Branch area.

He attended Hinton High School, however he received his diploma in service. He entered the army in May 1958, was discharged with reserve status in April 1961, and recalled to duty in October 1961.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Saturday at the Nimitz Baptist Church with the Rev. Sam Smith, Rev. H. G. Shrewsberry and Elder A. L. Neely in charge. Burial is to follow in the Crews Cemetery.

The body will be taken to the home Friday at 4 p.m. from the Ronald Meadows Funeral Parlors and to the church one hour before the funeral.

In addition to the parents, survivors include a brother, Zane Lowe of Jumping Branch and his grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Howard Vest of Nimitz and Mrs. Bessie Lowe of Jumping Branch.
