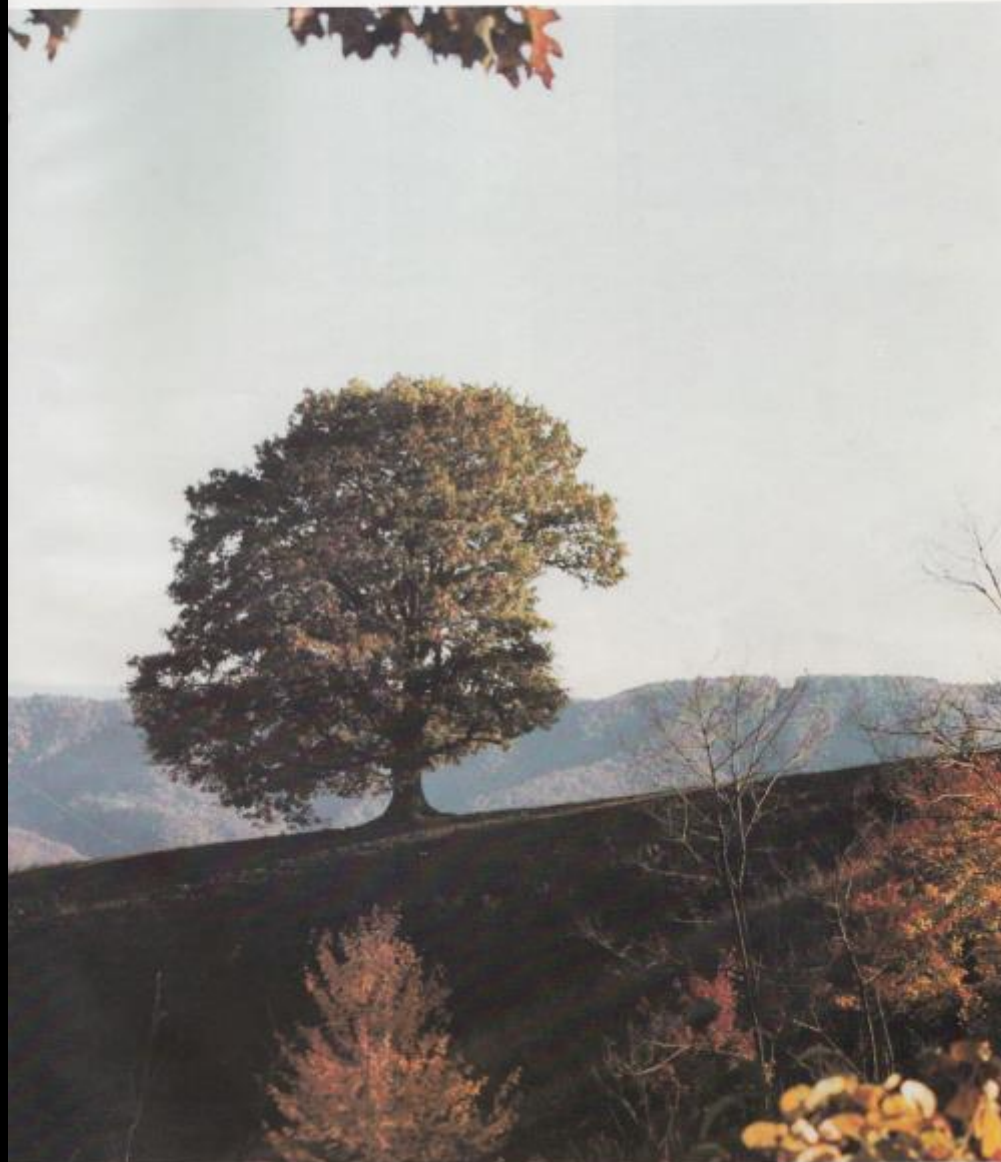

The final score was 40-12 with Mr. Hope able to score only once in each half, despite the fact that Coach Curio had cleared the bench. James Wynes' kickoffs usually left Mr. Hope starting out from deep in their own territory, while Mr. Hope's punting only set the 'Cars back 12-15 yards.

There are many more classes students can take at Hinton and the vocational school other than the standard classes like math, English, science and history. With each coming year, more classes are being offered to students. Some of the new classes offered the 1980-81 school year were Adult Roles and Functions, Drama, First Aid and Biology II. These classes enable students to gain in knowledge and experience in a variety of areas.

The bookstore originated last Spring when Mrs. Harcher and Kenny Altman thought that it would be nice to have items in the school so students could get them easier. The items consist of three different types: notebooks, orange and black pencils, and three different type shirts. Pencils sell the most.

The school's income is presently less than 15 dollars a week, which all goes for paying for merchandise on consignment.

The bookstore gets their materials from companies like Jostens, The School Supply Co. etc. We pay the companies more than the items could be bought for commercially because it costs more to have the school's name and mascot put on them.

The bookstore is operated by the Student Council. Only Student Council members work in the bookstore. There is no credit, activity points or payment of any kind for working.

Money from the bookstore would be contributed back to the school to help purchase new carpet for the auditorium, and floor mats at the doors with Bobcats on them, or some other needed merchandise.

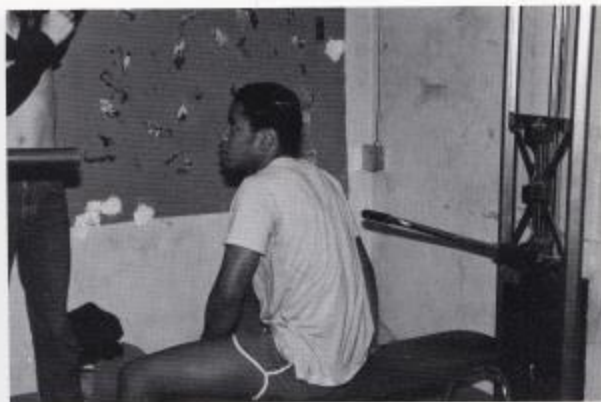

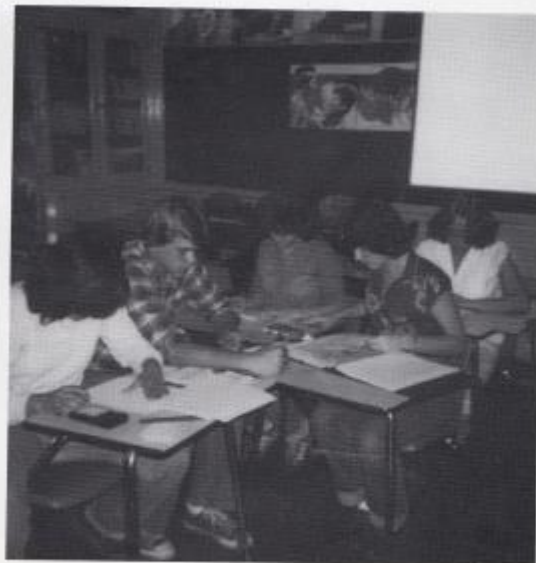

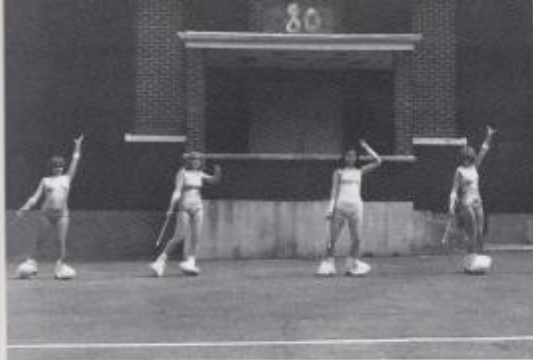

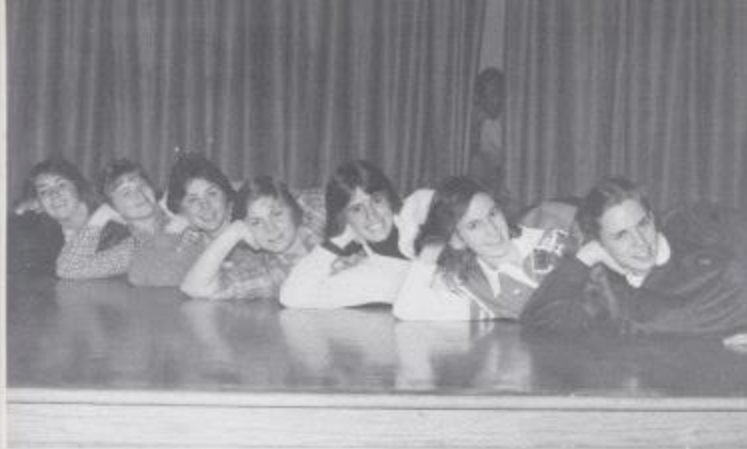

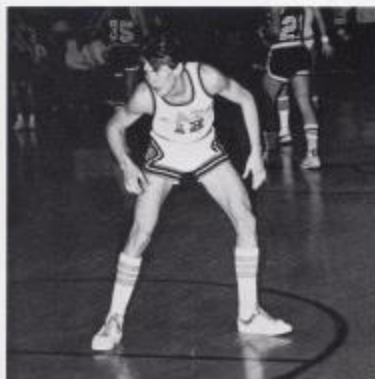

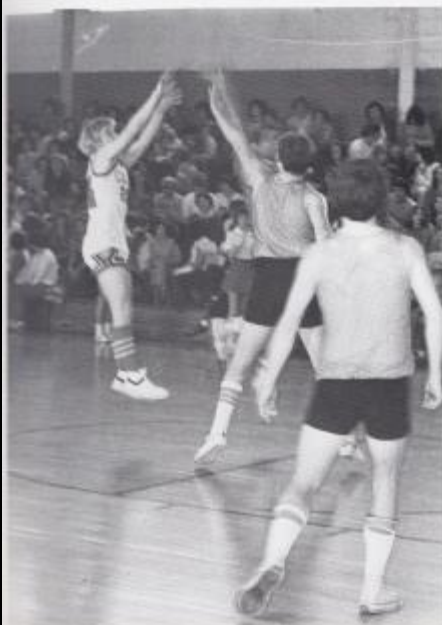

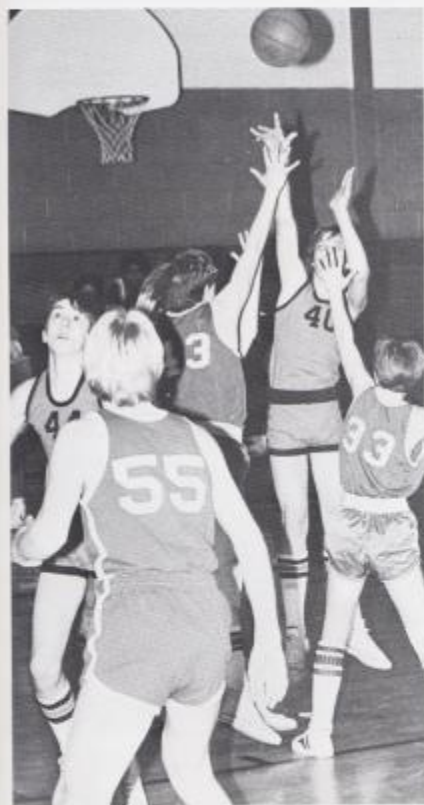


Experience Gained
