

With each coming year, more classes are being affered to students. Some of the new classes affered the 1980-81 school year were Adult Roles and Functions, Droma, First Aid and Biology II. These classes enable students to gain in knowledge and experience in a variety of areas.



Honor Students Recognized









Although the majority of the team had never played softball before, their second place finish in the sectional tournament was evidence of a successful season.


