Mrs. Foster, Nitro Civic Leader, Dies

Mrs. Nina May Warf Foster, 61, of 2413 25th St., Nitro, who was active in the First Presbyterian Church of Nitro and the Woman's Club of Nitro, died Monday at Charleston Memorial Hospital.

She also was a former secretary for the West Virginia Department of Welfare where she worked on the food stamp program. Mrs. Foster retired from that position in October 1970 after 18 years' service.

A former secretary at the First Presbyterian Church of Nitro, Mrs. Foster had served two terms as president of the Women of the Presbyterian Church, U. S., and was an honorary life member of that organization. She also was church historian, a circle leader and had taught Sunday school at the church for many years.

Mrs. Foster was a member and past president of the Woman's Club of Nitro and at the time of her death she was serving as vice president of the club.

She was the mother of Gerald Allan Foster of Nitro, who is band director at Nitro High School, and a sister of Mrs. Lillian Cooke-Pauley who is owner of the Cooke and Pauley Funeral Home of Nitro.

Also surviving: husband, Cecil Earl Foster; sons, Clinton Earl Foster of Warren, Ohio who is band master at the Western Reserve High School in Warren, Charles Edward Foster a senior at Marshall University and Melvin Phillip Foster of Belle; daughter, Mrs. Janice Millam of Nitro; mother, Mrs. Bertie Mae Warf of Nitro; sisters, Mrs. Merrell Love of Nitro, Mrs. Helen Osborne of Oriando, Fla.
