While in high school Jack excelled in baseball and basketball, selected on all-state teams. He also excelled in playing baseball and the trumpet throughout his college years at Wake Forest University, where he graduated in 1953 with a B.A. in business administration.

After his graduation Jack enlisted in the U. S. Army and was assigned to Army counter intelligence. OLC), Vietnam Service Medal, Good Conduct Medal, Armed Forces Reserve Medal, Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Palm, Joint Services Commendation Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Vietnam Staff Service Medal 1st. Class, Vietnam Air Service Medal, Legion of Merit and Air Medal. During his second tour in Vietnam he made over 25 flights over hostile territory. Jack now joins our many fallen men and women war veterans. He served his country well and will be missed greatly by his family and friends.

Surviving are a brother, Dr. E. Kent Rogers III of Asheville; a sister, Mary Lu Crawford of Vero Beach, Fla.; a beloved aunt, Drusilla O'Connor, and numerous nieces and nephews.
