
Ronald Edward Meadows

August 21, 1921 – October 2, 1941

HINTON, Oct. 3 — Ronald Edward Meadows, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. Lawn Meadows, of Jumping Branch, died about midnight Thursday in the Charleston General hospital, shortly after being admitted for treatment of a brain condition from which he had been suffering about two years.

A brain tumor which developed about the time of his graduation from Hinton High school in 1939 had resulted in periods of hospital treatment here, at Bluefield and at Johns-Hopkins hospital in Baltimore, Md., during the two years, and his condition had been apparently improved until Wednesday.

Born in the Jumping Branch section August 21, 1921, he was a member of the Bluestone Baptist church at Jumping Branch, and was one of the most popular and widely known young men in that community.

The body, which was brought to the Ronlad Meadows Funeral Home, was to be removed to the Meadows home at Jumping Branch Friday evening, and remain there until funeral services Sunday.

Funeral services will be held at 1 o'clock Sunday afternoon at the Bluestone Baptist church at Jumping Branch, by the pastor, the Rev. Charles E. Walker, and the Rev. F. G. Scarborough, and burial will follow in the family cemetery.

In addition to his parents he is survived by two brothers: Ruel Meadows, at home, and R. B. Meadows, of Huntington.
