HINTON TEACHER DIES FOLLOWING A LONG ILLNESS

Miss Maycle Callaham. 48, popular and widely known Hinton High School science instructor, died this morning at 5:15 o'clock in the Hinton Hospital after a long illness. Death was due to complications.

Although she had been in ill health for the last two years, her condition did not become critical until the last three weeks.

Miss Calaham was a lifelong resident of Hinton, and was born and reared in this city where she became well and favorably known.

She was a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. T. H. Calaham, pioneer Hinton residents, and was born February 5, 1905.

Miss Callaham was graduated from the Hinton High School with the class of 1923, and later attended Concord College, Fairmont State Normal and West Virginia University. She had been a teacher for the last 28 years.

Miss Calaham was a member of the Central Baptist church, and was most active in the work of the church. She was also a member of the Eastern Star. White Shrine, U. D. C., King's Daughters and the Business and Professionahl Women's Ciub.

Survivors include four brothers and two sisters who are as follows: Paul Callaham. Lake Forest, Ill.; Harold Callaham. Hinton; Carlos Callaham, Inez, Ky.; Arnold Callaham, Hinton; Mrs. M. A. Barnette, Hinton and Mrs. W. R. McCoy, Inez, Ky.
