# Looking Back at Yesterday, Reaching for Tomorrow



The Juniors, along with Nationwide, sponsored a Grim Reaper day, where every 26 minutes a student was taken out of class to represent the death of a teenager due to an alcohol related accident. There were 327 signatures in all and everyone who attended the prom signed.

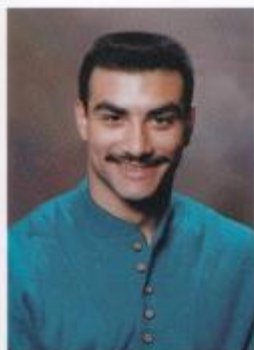

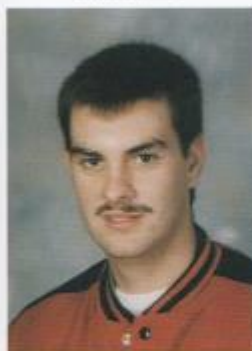

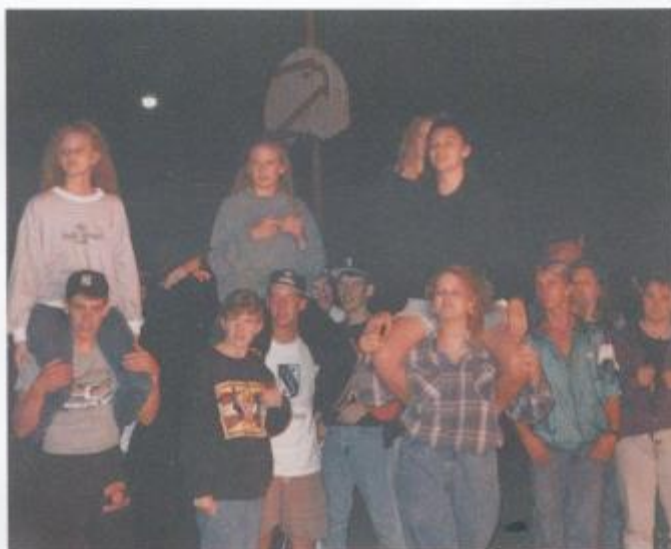
# WHITEWASHING

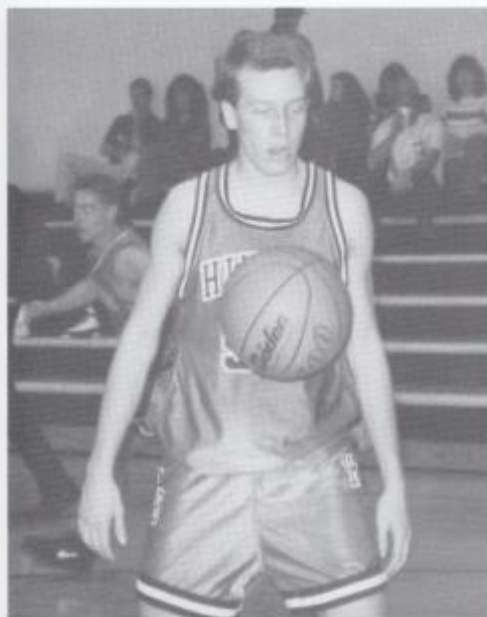

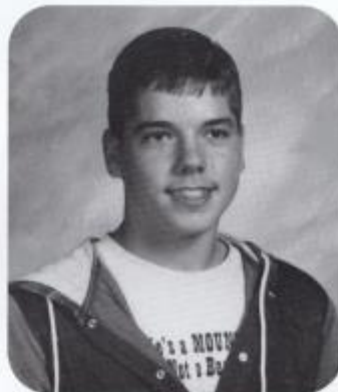

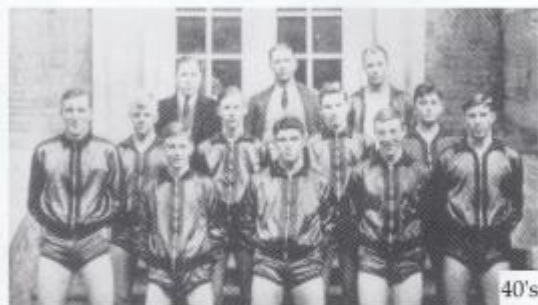

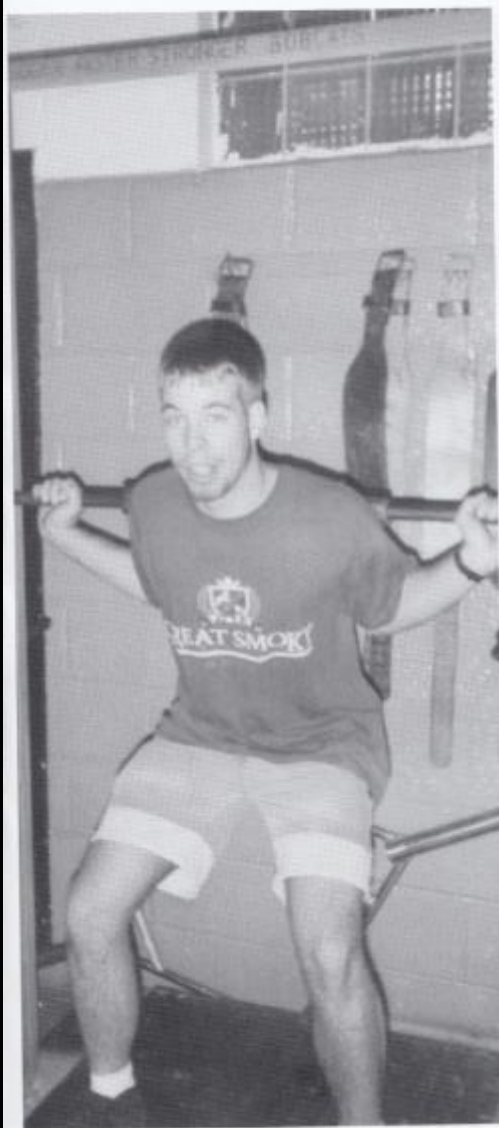

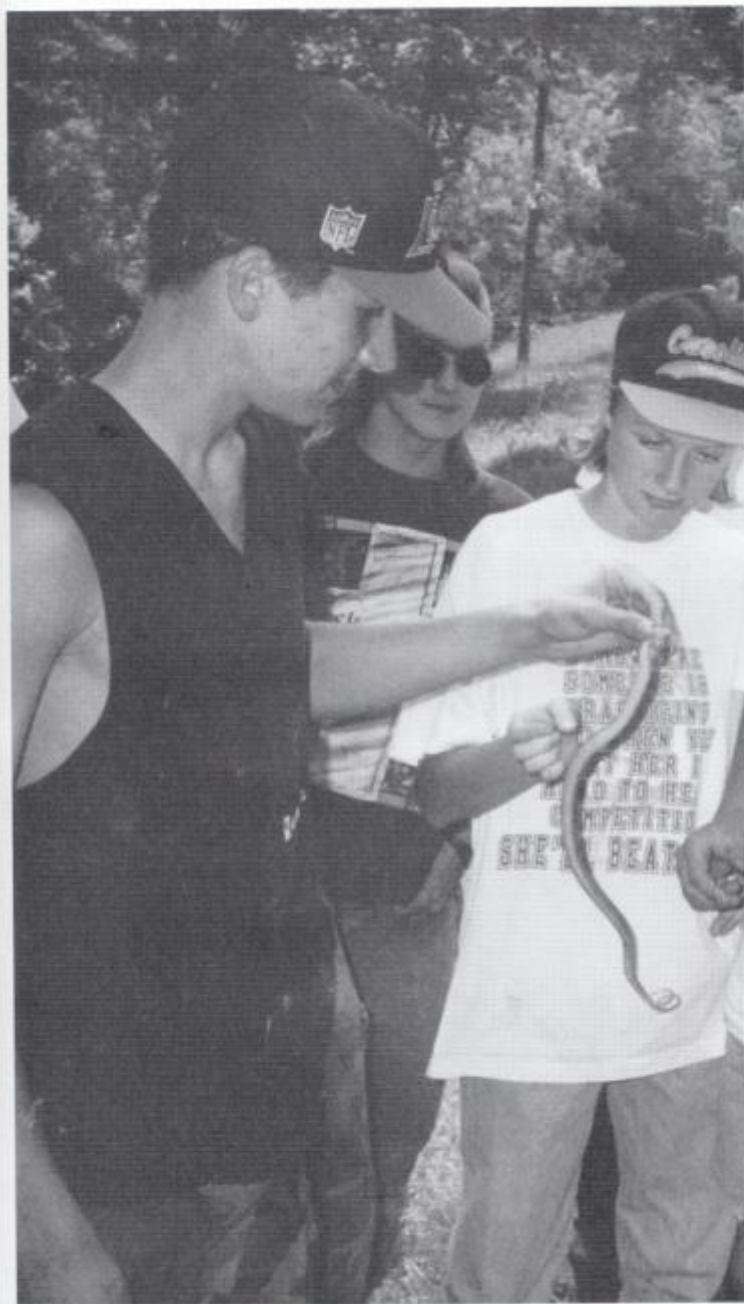

They are trained in how to improve their helping skills, how to contact helping resources when problems exceed their skills, and how to better care for themselves. After the Retreat Training students attend ongoing training either in a semester class or a less structured format -- where they explore topics of concern to students; such as chemical dependency, sexual abuse, stress, etc.

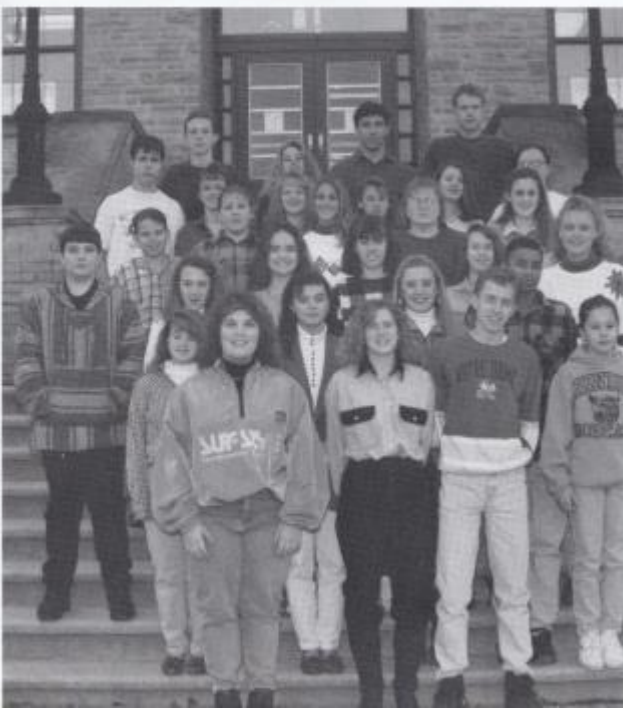

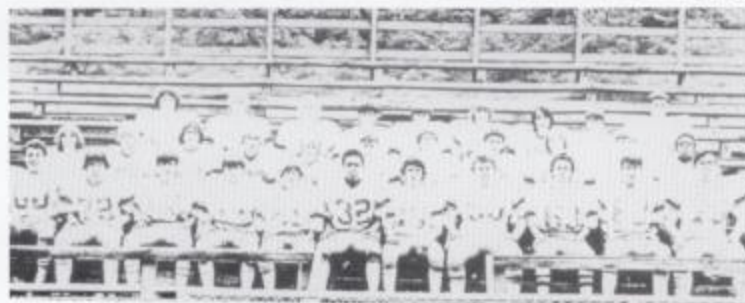

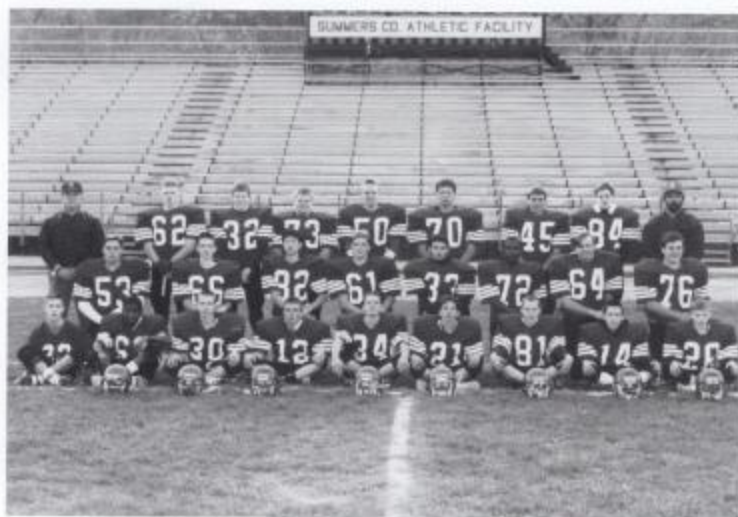

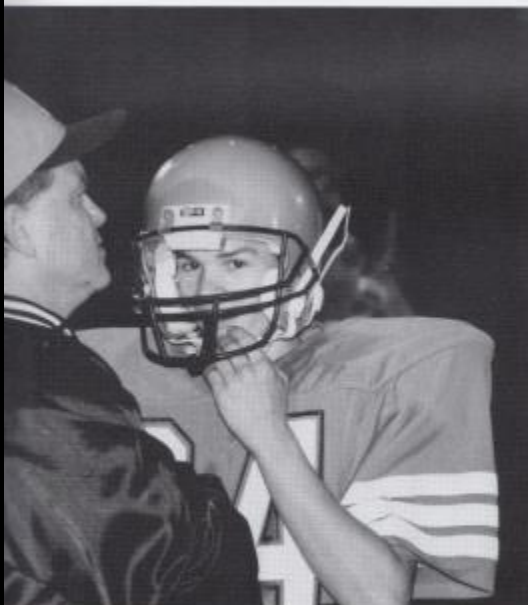

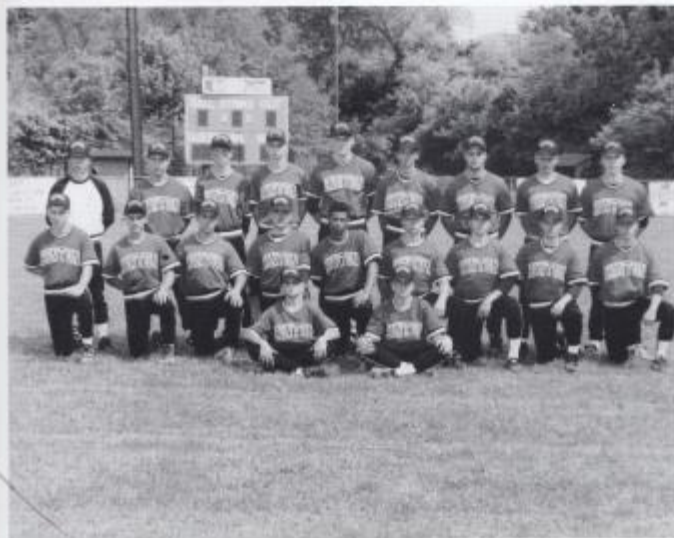
