Mr. Cooper was a native of Hinton and a graduate of the Hinton high school and completed the course as a pharmacist at the West Virginia university. He was a son of Mr. and Mrs. G. L. Cooper, of Hinton, and besides his parents, leaves three sisters, Mrs. E. M. Gould and Mrs. Roy Jones, of Huntington, and Mrs. R. B. Deel, of Logan, and two brothers, Clair, of Richwood, and John Cooper, of this city.

Mr. Cooper was a Mason and an Elk and was 25 years of age.
