Bonnie A. Peck, 98, of 191 Pleasant St., Hinton, died Monday, April 9, 2001, at Summers County Appalachian Regional Hospital, Hinton, following a long illness.

Born May 8, 1902, in Hinton, she was the daughter of the late N. Wilbur and Rosa Huffman Allen.

Mrs. Peck spent her childhood and was reared in Hinton, having lived most of her life in Hinton. She served as extension agent of Summers County for many years and had taught school at Wiggins School in Summers County.

She had been retired from state employment for many years.

Mrs. Peck was a member of Epsilon Sigma Phi (National Honorary Extension Fraternity), the West Virginia Agricultural Hall of Fame, West Virginia Extension 4-H Agents, the National 4-H Agents, West Virginia Agricultural Workers Organization, National Retired Teachers Association, West Virginia Retired Teachers Association, Summers County Retired Teachers Association, Bluestone Lake Garden Club, Delphi Club, West Virginia 4-H All Stars, First Presbyterian Church of Hinton and the Women of the Church.

She was also preceded in death by two sisters, Marie A. James and Nita A. Jordan; and a brother, Ross Allen.

Survivors include two nieces, Betty Ashley and her husband, Bill, of Pickens, S.C., and Jane Trowbridge of Huntington; and three great-nephews, James A. Ashley of Greenville, W. T. Ashley II of Tallahassee, Fla., and Brad S. Ashley of Vero Beach, Fla.

Services were held at 11 a. m. Thursday, April 12th. at First Presbyterian Church, Hinton, with the Rev. Stewart McMurray officiating.

Burial followed in Hilltop Cemetery, Hinton.
