William O. Burk, 71, died early Sat. morning, Dec. 1, at a Fairlea hospital, following a long illness.

Born May 3, 1919, at Hinton, he was the son of the late William L. and Annie O'Brien Burk.

Mr. Burk was a resident of Lewisburg for eight years, formerly of Bethesda, Md., was a member of the St. Catherine's Catholic Church of Ronceverte, and was a graduate of Hinton High School and the Winona School of Photography. He owned and operated the Burk's Studio of Hinton, and later became a medical photographer at the National Institute of Health, from which he was retired, he was a World War II U.S. Army veteran, was a member of the American Legion of Bethesda, Md., and was commander of the Lewisburg Composite Squadron of the Civil Air Patrol.

Survivors include his wife, Elizabeth Jones Burk of Lewisburg; a daughter, Elaine Burk of Lacy, Wash.; three sisters, Anna Thompson of Beckley, Sarah Smith of Hinton and Margie Beaver of San Antonio, Tex., and two brothers, James S. Burk of Charleston, and Doctor Glen P. McCormack of Slippery Rock, Penn.

Services were held Mon. Dec. 3 at 10 a.m. in the St. Catherine's Catholic Church at Ronceverte with Father Don Muriet officiating. Burial followed in the Cedar Hill Cemetery at Covington, Va.

The body was at the Wallace and Wallace Funeral Home in Lewisburg where a Scripture Service was held.
