





Ever will reminiscences of Hinton football, whether gridiron fortunes be at ebb or flood, turn first to 1937. About the round table where talk of Bobact glories flows in after years, always there will be mention first of "The Great Year"—1937—the year of the championship.

Seventeen years of organized football, years of good teams, bad, indifferent—they were all reincarnated in 1937. Hinton stood at the top, not only of her own football ladder, but of West Virginia's. "The iron men"—that swaggering nom de plume of news headlines—filtered into every mountain-bound crag, and with it went word of the prowess of the Bobcats.

Through eight games undefeated they went—these iron men who played for the feel of leather thudding against leather, and the sweat and the bruised and tired bodies and the exultation of victory when the game was over. Through a season marred only by a tie with the arch-rival Beckley, that game played in cold and mud while the scoreboard remained a blank and with the flying minutes, so Hinton thought, went hopes for a Bobcat championship. "The team that won't be beaten," they were dubbed after their first great performance, that gallant, courageous fight on a hot October afternoon at Charleston.

Football during those months held Hinton in a grip that spirited fans refused to shake. Wildly exultant over every triumph, those disciples of a conquering team followed it in hordes from victory to victory, and with that team and its followers went always soaring spirit and colorful, glorious conquest, 'til the state resounded with the story of Hinton's ironmen and their faithful fans.

That afternoon at the capital was the beginning. Hinton, with an off-year team, short on number, long on fight, moving into the city to battle the Mountain Lions, proteges of the former Bobcat coach, Irish Garrity, and due for a beating. Under a blazing sun that sapped strength from arms and legs like drops of water from a scorched earth, the 13 black-and-white-clad warriors gained a precious 9.7 lead. Like demons, with dagged, unrelenting determination, they battled to hold it, giving no quarter, asking none. Exhaustion, utter fatique, clawed at them like a thousand tormenting devils. Every second's rest was precious, to be spent face down on the hard-packed sod, gulping deep, unhurried breaths, relaxing battered bodies.

That was the take-off. Slim as it was, that two-point lead belonged to Hinton when the last scorching minute had passed. Two games had been won in the early weeks of the grind. Breathers, they were—Rainelle, 35-6; Fayette

The ironmen were on their way. Butler, all-state backfield material, flanked by Lilly, commanding, Dodd and Ratliff. Big, heady linesmen—Lipscomb, all-state, and his henchmen, Harris, Powell and Gill, Parry, Cales, Stone and Tyree. The reserves—Vass and Foster. Coach Johnny Worth, in his second year at the helm, and Assistants Paul Smith and Bun Goff. Onward they swept, halting for nothing, across West Virginia's gridings, title bound.

Mt. Hope fell, 13-7, after a second great uphill struggle before a giant crowd. Oak Hill, 13-6; Benwood Union, 13-0. A week of needed rest. Then East Bank, 19-6, with a special train to Cabin Creek, carrying 400 of the most loyal fans in the state, and a wild welcome by a thousand more on the return.

Two weeks, nearly three, of rest. Then Beckley and that wilderness of mud. 0-0. Downhearted, thwarted from a championship at the very gates, Hinton, its team and its disciples, returned home with dreams of a title all but shattered.

Then, December 4, the news came unofficially over the wires. The West Virginia Sports Writers Association, balloting for the first time for a state champion, gave Hinton 11 votes, all others seven. First recognized champions in many years, the Bobcats and the city celebrated the first title ever to come to Hinton.

Triumph after triumph came in the weeks that followed. Again Hinton's name echoed from mountain to mountain, in praise, in jest or protest. Butler and Lipscomb, key men of the team, drew places of honor everywhere, then on the official all-state team. Thus honored for the first time in four years, the Bobcats landed two for the first time in history.

To the North-South game went Johnny Worth as head coach of the South team, Butler and Lipscomb as players. A 27-0 victory for the South, largest score ever before recorded in the history of the game. Again that echo—"Hinton . . ."

Conquest rode with Hinton that fall—conquest and glory, honor and never-failing loyalty—that year of the championship.
